

### Pet Supply Kit checklist:

| <input type="checkbox"/> Food. Keep several days' supply of food in an airtight, waterproof container.  |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Water. Store a water bowl and several days' supply of water.   |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Medicine. Keep an extra supply of the medicine your pet takes on a regular basis in a waterproof container.  |
| <input type="checkbox"/> First aid kit (Talk to your veterinarian about what is most appropriate for your pet's emergency medical needs).   |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Collar with ID tag and a harness or leash. Include a backup leash, collar and ID tag. Have copies of your pet's registration information and other relevant documents in a waterproof container and available electronically.      |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Traveling bag, crate or sturdy carrier, ideally one for each pet.  |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Grooming items. Pet shampoo, conditioner and other items, in case your pet needs some cleaning up.   |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Sanitation needs. Include pet litter and litter box (if appropriate), newspapers, paper towels, plastic trash bags and household chlorine bleach to provide for your pet's sanitation needs.                                       |
| <input type="checkbox"/> A picture of you and your pet together. If you become separated from your pet during an emergency, a picture of you and your pet together will help you document ownership and allow others to assist you in identifying your pet. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Familiar items. Put favorite toys, treats or bedding in your kit. Familiar items can help reduce stress for your pet.  |
