Environmental Protective Agency (EPA) Accredited Lead Certifications

Onondaga County provides training for contractors, property managers, homeowners, and landlords to teach lead-safe work practices in homes where lead-based paint may be disturbed.

EPA Renovation Repair and Painting (RRP) Certifications

The Lead Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) Rule establishes requirements for individuals and firms performing renovations.

RRP Individual Certification

This certification provides an individual worker with the ability to perform renovation, repair, and painting work in houses, apartments, and child-occupied facilities (such as schools and childcare centers) that were built before 1978. It includes pre-renovation education requirements as well as training, firm certification, and work practice requirements.

RRP Firm Certification

Once an individual receives the above mentioned training, they can go to the EPA's website and apply for a "Firm Certification." This additional certification allows the individual to become a certified renovator, able to train their workers on the Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) Rule.

Firms performing renovations must ensure that:

- All individuals performing activities that disturb painted surfaces on behalf of the firm are either certified renovators or have been trained by a certified renovator.
- A certified renovator is assigned to each renovation and performs all of the certified renovator responsibilities.
- All renovations performed by the firm are performed in accordance with work practice standards of the RRP Program.
- Pre-renovation education and lead pamphlet distribution requirements of the RRP Program are performed.
- The program's recordkeeping requirements are met.

EPA Abatement Supervisor

This certification is typically taken by a General Contractor/Company Owner and certifies them to perform all of the duties of a Lead Abatement Worker while additionally certifying them to be responsible for occupant safety during the abatement process and for writing the abatement plan. Individuals who receive this certification learn lead-based paint abatement and regulatory guidelines for those individuals that will plan and/or oversee lead abatement work. You must have at least two years of construction experience to be eligible for this certification.

EPA Abatement Worker

Abatement is any set of measures designed to permanently eliminate lead-based paint hazards. Abatement workers must work under a Certified Lead Abatement Supervisor (mentioned above).
