

Tobacco Retailer Density in Syracuse



Retailer Fast Facts

Syracuse has **179** tobacco retailers. That is **15 times more** tobacco retailers than Dunkin' locations and **36 times more** than Burger King restaurants.



Retailer Density Impacts Youth and Lower-Income Residents

Syracuse has **7.1** tobacco retailers per square mile and **1.2** tobacco retailers per 1,000 residents. School aged youth (5-19 years old) and lower-income residents are at high risk for exposure to tobacco retailers.

Tobacco Retailer Density per 1,000 School Aged Youth

155 tobacco retailers are within 750 feet of a K-12 school, park, or another tobacco vendor.

There are currently **5.3** retailers per 1,000 school aged youth in Syracuse. Four (4) of the City's census tracts have **more than 30.0** tobacco retailers per 1,000 school aged youth.


Lower income neighborhoods

42 of the City's retailers are in lower - income neighborhoods (census tracts) compared to only **15** in higher - income neighborhoods.

Data are for youth ages 5-19 years.

Tobacco Retailers, K-12 Schools, and Parks in Syracuse

86.6% of tobacco retailers in Syracuse are **higher exposure retailers** meaning they are within 750 feet of a K-12 school, municipal park or another tobacco retailer.
