Discussion: The discussion centered on the role of the Human Rights Commission (HRC) in addressing the recent situation involving the Jordan-Elbridge Central School District. Participants highlighted the positive impact the HRC made within the community, particularly regarding the experiences of two students of color who reported instances of bullying and targeting based on their race. It was noted that one of the students chose to leave the J-E School District, while the other remained. The HRC Commissioners also discussed whether appropriate protocols were followed in managing the cases of the students accused of bullying. Lastly, there was a proposal to consider establishing an honorary Vice Chair position to ensure continuity in leadership during the absence of the elected Chair.
