WHEREAS, the Lake Loop Trail (boardwalk) at Beaver Lake Nature Center, which spans approximately three miles, was originally constructed between 1978 and 1987; and

WHEREAS, despite multiple piecemeal repairs over the years, the wooden structure has significantly deteriorated, with some sections remaining submerged throughout much of the year; and

WHEREAS, a structural assessment conducted in the spring of 2019 recommended replacing the existing pilings with helical piles to enhance stability and reduce the impact of environmental factors on the structure; and

WHEREAS, the Onondaga County Parks Department commenced a boardwalk replacement project in the fall of 2024, successfully replacing 2,053 feet of boardwalk in spring 2025 (Phase 1); and

WHEREAS, in spring 2025, the Parks Department submitted a grant application to the New York State Department of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation under the 2025 Municipal Parks Grant Program, requesting \$1,000,000 to replace the remaining 523 feet of deteriorated boardwalk (Phase 2); and

WHEREAS, the County was awarded the \$1,000,000 grant to fund Phase 2, and it is the intent of this Legislature to amend the 2025 County Budget to accept the grant; and

WHEREAS, to assist with Phase 2, the Friends of Beaver Lake Nature Center have pledged up to \$250,000 in support; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the 2025 Onondaga County Budget be amended to accept the grant award from the 2025 Municipal Parks and Recreation Program, administered by the New York State Department of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, for the purpose of completing Phase 2 of the boardwalk replacement project at Beaver Lake Nature Center; and, be it further




