

Section 4. The faith and credit of said County of Onondaga, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer of such County. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Chief Fiscal Officer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer of such County. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Chief Fiscal Officer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. The County Executive is authorized to enter into contracts to implement the intent of this resolution. In the event that the General Fund Operating Surplus Funds are available at the end of the fiscal year, and if the Chief Fiscal Officer of Onondaga County deems it fiscally advantageous to use surplus funds rather than borrowing, all or a portion of the cost of the improvements authorized herein shall

be paid using such surplus funds. Further, in the event that General Fund Operating Surplus Funds are so utilized, then the authorization to issue bonds provided within this resolution is hereby rescinded accordingly, reduced by the amount of funds utilized.

Section 8. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or

Scope & Details

Onondaga County has developed and is implementing an Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) management strategy in order to minimize the hazard risk to the community, the impact of EAB on County operations and to plan for and minimize EAB costs (tree removal/inoculation, manpower and equipment, disposal and tree replacement). All County-owned ash trees with potential targets in the drop zone (people or physical assets) will need to be removed or inoculated to protect the public, protect assets and reduce liability.

The County owns approximately 300 parcels of land covering roughly 8,000 acres (including parkland, water supply and wastewater treatment plants, drainage districts, pumping stations, radio towers and institutional campuses for uses including administration, correctional facilities, emergency response operations and more) and nearly 800 miles of highway rights-of-way. These properties are home to tens of thousands of ash trees. Steps must be taken by the County to ensure that the threat of harm to humans and/or damage to County-owned property is minimized, that the public cost of managing affected trees on County-owned property is minimized and that overall disruption in the community is minimized (including tree replacement needs). To this end, the County has taken the following steps:

1. Conducted an inventory of ash trees on County-owned property
2. Managing ash trees on county owned properties (treating or removing)
3. Helping organize a community-wide task force to coordinate a Community EAB Management Strategy.

The inventory of ash trees (location, size, health, nearby targets) was initiated in 2012 and was completed in 2014. Early management efforts have been aimed at removing priority hazard trees, and damaged trees that are likely to become priority hazard trees in critical areas.

Scope & Details

Each year, Onondaga County undertakes a comprehensive approach with maintenance, rehabilitation and asset renewal across its facilities to ensure they remain safe, functional, and responsive to community needs. This ongoing work supports the long-term preservation and modernization of critical infrastructure, including administrative buildings, public safety facilities, and shared-use spaces.

The aim is to extend the useful life of County assets, enhance operational efficiency, comply with safety and accessibility standards, and adapt to new demands. By proactively investing in buildings, structural improvements, and technology upgrades, the County safeguards public investment and maintains effective service for residents and staff alike.

On December 5th, 2017, bond resolution 2017-192 authorized the issuance of \$5,186,000 for improvements to various public facilities.

On December 3rd, 2019, bond resolution 2019-177 authorized the issuance of \$1,500,000 for the following work:

- Renovations to the ceremonial courtrooms in the Old Courthouse
- Upgrades to the security doors at Hillbrook Detention Facility
- Renovations and abatement of the crime analysis center in the Public Safety Building
- Replacement and repair of various sidewalks
- Repair of brickwork in the Civic Center
- Remainder of funds used for public health initiatives (barriers, mitigation equipment)

CAPITAL PROJECTS

On February 1st, 2022, bond resolution 2022-020 authorized the issuance of \$3,995,000 for the improvements to various County buildings.

On February 7th, 2023, bond resolution 2023-010 authorized the issuance of \$2,115,000. These funds, in addition to \$470,000 cash and \$1,000,000 in federal aid, will be used for the following work:

- Army Reserve renovation and reconfiguration for Emergency Management

Scope & Details

This project supports critical upgrades to the DH&C steam plant, with the goal of improving system reliability, reducing maintenance costs, and restoring full operational capacity. Several aging and failure-prone components were identified for replacement or repair. Bond Resolution 2019-178 authorized \$700,000 to fund this work, which began in late 2020. Most elements are now either complete or in progress.

1. Boiler and HVAC Control Upgrades

The existing boiler controls—over a decade old—frequently fail and depend on proprietary technology serviced only by an out-of-state provider, resulting in long delays and high costs. These are being replaced with modern, non-proprietary systems that are more reliable and easier to maintain. HVAC controls across the downtown campus are also being upgraded, with outdated, standalone computers replaced by a centralized server and improved equipment to enhance integration and efficiency.

2. Cooling Tower & Chiller Improvements

Many cooling tower drain pans are over 15 years old and have become corroded and leaky, reducing system efficiency and wasting water and chemicals. These pans are being repaired or replaced to match the lifespan of the chillers they support. Additionally, internal coolers in chiller control panels are being upgraded with higher-capacity units to prevent overheating and reduce shutdown risk during peak demand.

3. Chiller Power Restoration

Of the plant's six chillers, four are currently powered by the utility grid. Two remain offline after their dedicated generators were decommissioned. To restore full system capacity, these two chillers will be reconnected to the utility grid.

This project will upgrade and expand exterior lighting at multiple buildings within the Onondaga County complex. Its primary objectives are to improve visibility and safety, increase energy efficiency, reduce maintenance costs, and provide greater flexibility in lighting control.

Work on this project will provide fully installed operational lighting fixtures, a centralized control panel, and staff training. Interior lighting improvements and major electrical system upgrades are generally excluded from this scope unless identified as necessary during implementation. Construction of additional meeting room space:

Currently, have 10 meeting rooms which limits our ability to compete for larger conventions. Improvement will create five (5) additional meeting rooms. Will involve construction of a structural deck over the current Atrium area adjacent to lower-level ballroom.

Technology Infrastructure Improvements:

Events currently being solicited for the Convention Center (large attendee conventions, e-sport events, etc) have tremendous need for high-speed internet and the availability of superior wireless technology.

The IT backbone infrastructure in the building needs a significant overhaul to include:

New switching (Core and Edge)

All new Ethernet and fiber cabling. This is underway.

Meeting Room Technology:

All meeting rooms in the building are in need of smart boards, large screen monitors, state-of-the-art sound systems and video conferencing technology. This is included in the additional meeting room project.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

In March 2023, we received legislative authorization for \$500,000 in cash for continuation of yearly improvements required to maintain the marketability and operations. Our current focus is on security, such as expansion of surveillance. Also, we will upgrade sections of data infrastructure. We will improve railing systems in the theaters as well as the concession bars. Seating in the theaters is under review for rehabilitation.

In 2026 we intent to seek legislative authorization for an additional \$750,000 to continue the ongoing improvements to the various venues of the OnCenter complex.

The scope includes:

1. Testing and investigation to identify hazardous materials.
2. Design and planning for proper removal or containment.
3. On-site monitoring during remediation activities.
4. Legal disposal of hazardous materials.
5. Remediation work for identified substances.

Hazardous substances may include asbestos, PCBs (polychlorinated biphenyls), lead and petroleum. This will also address other hazardous materials as defined by regulatory agencies.

Further, in the event that General Fund Operating Surplus Funds are so utilized, then the authorization to issue bonds provided within this resolution is hereby rescinded accordingly, reduced by the amount of funds utilized.

Scope & Details

Carpenter's Brook Fish Hatchery, the only publicly run fish hatchery in the state, has been in continuous operation since its inception in 1938 and produces 70,000+ Brook, Brown and Rainbow Trout annually. Staff and volunteers take great pride in stocking over 100 miles of streams and 10,000 acres of impoundments.

The existing structures at the Carpenters Brook Fish Hatchery are inefficient and deteriorating to the point of near-failure. To improve efficiency, reduce risk, and increase the overall desirability of the park, a unified building will house all operations currently done by the existing structures. In addition, the existing restroom facility will receive a renovation.

Phase I (\$120,000):

2026: Hire an Architect/Engineering firm to design the new hatchery building. The building will contain the necessary tanks for rearing eggs to fingerlings, as well as additional educational resources.

Phase II (\$1,005,000):

2027: Construct new building to house offices, diet room, oil storage and hatchery operations (\$900,000)

2028: Renovate the existing restroom facility, which includes components that are no longer replaceable (\$105,000).

In 2026, we intend to seek legislative authorization for \$120,000 in borrowing to finance the design phase of this project. In 2027 we intend to seek authorization for all costs in Phase II construction.

PURPOSE:

Roster update/change request

OBJECTIVE/ WORK PLAN:

The County Clerk's office currently has two Clerk III positions (Grade 7) and 13 Clerk 2/Recording Clerk positions (Grade 5). We are requesting to add an additional Clerk III position to the roster and abolish an existing (vacant) Recording Clerk.

This office is highly nuanced and operationally complex, and promoting long-term careers within the department is critical to maintaining stability and expertise. Without clear opportunities for internal growth, we risk losing experienced staff to advancement opportunities in other departments.

Expanding the number of Clerk III positions would significantly increase our capacity to train and mentor new employees, while also allowing for greater cross-training. This would result in a more versatile workforce, with staff capable of supporting multiple teams as operational needs shift.

The current leap from Recording Clerk directly to Deputy is not a realistic or effective career progression. A Clerk III role serves as an essential steppingstone, supporting skill development and preparing employees for higher-level responsibilities. Additionally, hiring Deputies externally has proven challenging; individuals without prior experience in our office face a much steeper learning curve compared to candidates who have developed institutional knowledge through years of clerical work.

FUNDING SOURCE:

Funding for this change will be available due to 2026 salary budget savings from unpaid leave as well as roster vacancies in the months of January and February.

BUDGET:

Maximum impact is \$6,765 for an entire year at Step 4. However, the amount needed to cover this change for the remainder of this year will be less than \$6,765 because it won't take effect until March/April and will not start at Step 4. Fringe and benefits, to our understanding, will remain the same.

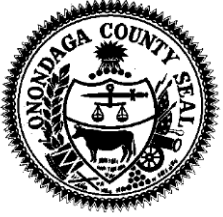

SUBJECT: Tentative Labor Agreement – CNNY Building Trades Council

Enclosed for your review and consideration is a tentative agreement for a successor Collective Bargaining Agreement, (hereinafter “CBA”) between Onondaga County and Central and Northern New York Building Trades Council (hereinafter “BTC”) for a four (4) year term January 1, 2026- December 31, 2029.

The Agreement provides for a 4% wage adjustment effective the first full pay period in January each year 2026-2029. Additionally in year one (1) 2026 effective the first full pay period after 1/1/2026 there will be a base wage market adjustment of \$4.00/hour for Electrician, Plumber & Steamfitter trades and a base wage market adjustment of \$1.00/hour for all other trades. This will enable us to remain competitive and close the wage gap with prevailing rates. New Articles related to Paid Time Off in year one and the Health Care Coalition were added. Language revisions for On Call Compensation as well as overtime language, health and dental benefits and sick leave were made to reflect current protocols. The approximate net cost of the package is \$2,468,370.

The Agreement has been ratified by the membership vote and is now scheduled to come before you for your meeting scheduled on March 24, 2026

Attached, please find the Tentative agreements and salary schedules for 2026-2029 that reflect the wage increases.

RESOLUTION NO. 64

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE PURSUANT TO SECTION 90.10 OF THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW OF REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, TO BE DESIGNATED SUBSTANTIALLY “PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT REFUNDING (SERIAL) BONDS”, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN RELATION THERETO AND THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS TO BE REFUNDED THEREBY

WHEREAS, the County of Onondaga, New York (hereinafter, the “County”) heretofore issued (i) \$79,900,000 General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2015 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before May 28, 2015 (the “2015 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2015 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2015, being dated May 28, 2015 with remaining maturities on May 15 in each of the years 2026 through 2045, both inclusive (the “2015 Bonds”); (ii) \$35,885,500 General Obligation Refunding (Serial) Bonds, 2016 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before November 16, 2016 (the “2016 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2016 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation Refunding (Serial) Bonds, 2016, being dated November 16, 2016 with remaining maturities on March 1 in each of the years 2026 through 2030, both inclusive (the “2016 Bonds”); (iii) \$21,780,000 General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2017 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before July 26, 2017 (the “2017 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2017 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2017, being dated July 26, 2017 with remaining maturities on April 15 in each of the years 2026 through 2037, both inclusive (the “2017 Bonds”); (iv) \$51,960,000 General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2018 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before October 11, 2018 (the “2018 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2018 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2018, being dated October 11, 2018 with remaining maturities on April 15 in each of the years 2026 through 2038, both inclusive (the “2018 Bonds”); and (v) \$44,777,388 General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2019 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before July 3, 2019 (the “2019 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2019 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2019, being dated July 3, 2019 with remaining maturities on June 1 in each of the years 2026 through 2039, both inclusive (the “2019 Bonds” and, together with the 2015 Bonds, 2016 Bonds, 2017 Bonds and 2018 Bonds, the “Refunded Bonds”); and

WHEREAS, it would be in the public interest to refund all or a portion of the remaining outstanding callable principal balance of the Refunded Bonds by the issuance of refunding bonds pursuant to Section 90.00 or Section 90.10, as applicable, of the Local Finance Law; and

WHEREAS, such refunding will only be undertaken if it results in present value savings in debt service as required by Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the County Legislature of the County of Onondaga, New York, as follows:

Section 1. For the object or purpose of refunding the outstanding callable principal balance of the Refunded Bonds as more fully set forth in the Refunding Financial Plan (hereinafter defined), including providing moneys which, together with the interest earned from the investment of certain of the proceeds of the refunding bonds herein authorized, shall be sufficient to pay (i) the principal amount of such Refunded Bonds, (ii) the aggregate amount of unmatured interest payable on such Refunded Bonds to

and including the date on which the Refunded Bonds which are callable are to be called prior to their respective maturities in accordance with the refunding financial plan, as hereinafter defined, (iii) the costs and expenses incidental to the issuance of the refunding bonds herein authorized, including the development of the refunding financial plan, as hereinafter defined, costs and expenses of executing and performing the terms and conditions of the escrow contract or contracts, as hereinafter defined, and fees and charges of the escrow holder or holders, as hereinafter mentioned, (iv) the premium or premiums for a policy or policies of municipal bond insurance or cost or costs of other credit enhancement facility or facilities, for the refunding bonds herein authorized, or any portion thereof, there are hereby authorized to be issued not exceeding \$130,000,000 refunding serial bonds of the County pursuant to the provisions of Section 90.00 or Section 90.10, as applicable, of the Local Finance Law (the "Refunding Bonds"), it being anticipated that the amount of Refunding Bonds actually to be issued will be approximately \$98,520,000, as provided in Section 4 hereof. The Refunding Bonds shall each be designated substantially "PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT REFUNDING (SERIAL) BOND" together with such series designation and year as is appropriate on the date of sale thereof, shall be of the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof (except for any odd denominations, if necessary) not exceeding the principal amount of each respective maturity, shall be numbered with the prefix "R" followed by a dash and then from 1 upward, shall be dated on such dates, and shall mature annually on such dates in such years, bearing interest semi-annually on such dates, at the rate or rates of interest per annum, as may be necessary to sell the same, all as shall be determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer pursuant to Section 4 hereof. It is hereby further determined that (a) such Refunding Bonds may be issued in series, (b) such Refunding Bonds may be sold at a discount in the manner authorized by paragraph a of Section 57.00 of the Local Finance Law pursuant to subdivision 2 of paragraph f of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law, and (c) such Refunding Bonds may be issued as a single consolidated issue. It is hereby further determined that such Refunding Bonds may be issued to refund all, or any portion of, the Refunded Bonds, subject to approval by the State Comptroller.

Section 2. The Refunding Bonds may be subject to redemption prior to maturity upon such terms as the Chief Fiscal Officer shall prescribe, which terms shall be in compliance with the requirements of Section 53.00 (b) of the Local Finance Law. If less than all of the Refunding Bonds of any maturity are to be redeemed, the particular refunding bonds of such maturity to be redeemed shall be selected by the County by lot in any customary manner of selection as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer. Notice of such call for redemption shall be given by providing notice to the registered owners not less than thirty (30) days prior to such date. Notice of redemption having been given as aforesaid, the bonds so called for redemption shall, on the date for redemption set forth in such call for redemption, become due and payable, together with interest to such redemption date, and interest shall cease to be paid thereon after such redemption date.

The Refunding Bonds shall be issued in registered form and shall not be registrable to bearer or convertible into bearer coupon form. When issued, the Refunding Bonds shall be initially issued in denominations such that one bond shall be issued for each maturity of bonds and shall be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of The Depository Trust Company, Jersey City, New Jersey ("DTC"), which will act as securities depository for the bonds in accordance with the Book-Entry-Only system of DTC. In the event that either DTC shall discontinue the Book-Entry-Only system or the County shall terminate its participation in such Book-Entry-Only system, such bonds shall thereafter be issued in certificated form of the denomination of \$5,000 each or any integral multiple thereof (except for any odd denominations, if necessary) not exceeding the principal amount of each respective maturity. Principal of and interest on the bonds shall be payable to DTC, or to its nominee, Cede & Co., while the bonds are registered in the name of Cede & Co. in accordance with such Book-Entry-Only System. Principal shall only be payable upon surrender of the bonds at the principal corporate trust office of the Chief Fiscal Officer.

In the event said Refunding Bonds are issued in non-book entry form, principal of and interest on the Refunding Bonds shall be payable by check or draft mailed by the Fiscal Agent (as hereinafter defined) to the registered owners of the Refunding Bonds as shown on the registration books of the County maintained by the Fiscal Agent (as hereinafter defined), as of the close of business on the fifteenth day of the calendar month or first business day of the calendar month preceding each interest payment date as appropriate and as provided in a certificate of the Chief Fiscal Officer providing for the details of the Refunding Bonds. Principal shall only be payable upon surrender of bonds at the principal corporate trust office of a bank or trust company or banks or trust companies located or authorized to do business in the State of New York, as shall hereafter be designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer as fiscal agent of the County for the Refunding Bonds (collectively the "Fiscal Agent").

Principal and interest on the Refunding Bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of America.

The Chief Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement or agreements containing such terms and conditions as he shall deem proper with the Fiscal Agent, for the purpose of having such bank or trust company or banks or trust companies act, in connection with the Refunding Bonds, as the Fiscal Agent for said County, to perform the services described in Section 70.00 of the Local Finance Law, and to execute such agreement or agreements on behalf of the County, regardless of whether the Refunding Bonds are initially issued in certificated or non-certificated form.

The Chief Fiscal Officer is hereby further delegated all powers of this County Legislature with respect to agreements for credit enhancement, derived from and pursuant to Section 168.00 of the Local Finance Law, for said Refunding Bonds, including, but not limited to the determination of the provider of such credit enhancement facility or facilities and the terms and contents of any agreement or agreements related thereto.

The Refunding Bonds shall be executed in the name of the County by the manual signature of the Chief Fiscal Officer, and its corporate seal shall be imprinted thereon. The Refunding Bonds shall contain the recital required by subdivision 4 of paragraph j of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law and the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Chief Fiscal Officer shall determine. It is hereby determined that it is to the financial advantage of the County not to impose and collect from registered owners of the Refunding Bonds any charges for mailing, shipping and insuring bonds transferred or exchanged by the Fiscal Agent, and, accordingly, pursuant to paragraph c of Section 70.00 of the Local Finance Law, no such charges shall be so collected by the Fiscal Agent.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that:

- (a) the maximum amount of the Refunding Bonds authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution does not exceed the limitation imposed by subdivision 1 of paragraph b of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law;
- (b) the maximum period of probable usefulness permitted by law at the time of the issuance of the Refunded Bonds for each object or purpose for which such Refunded Bonds were issued is as specified in each of the 2015 Bond Certificate, 2016 Bond Certificate, 2017 Bond Certificate, 2018 Bond Certificate and 2019 Bond Certificate, which is incorporated herein by reference;

- (c) the last installment of the Refunding Bonds will mature not later than the expiration of the respective period of probable usefulness of the objects or purposes for which said Refunded Bonds were issued in accordance with the provisions of subdivision 1 of paragraph c of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law;
- (d) the estimated present value of the total debt service savings anticipated as a result of the issuance of the Refunding Bonds, computed in accordance with the provisions of subdivision 2 of paragraph b of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law, with regard to the Refunded Bonds is as shown in the Refunding Financial Plan described in Section 4 hereof.

Section 4. The financial plan for the refunding authorized by this resolution (the “Refunding Financial Plan”), showing the sources and amounts of all moneys required to accomplish such refunding, the estimated present value of the total debt service savings and the basis for the computation of the aforesaid estimated present value of total debt service savings, are set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part of this resolution. The Refunding Financial Plan has been prepared based upon the assumption that the Refunding Bonds will be issued in one series, and that the Refunding Bonds will mature, be of such terms, and bear interest as set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part of this resolution. This County Legislature recognizes that the Refunding Bonds may be issued in one or more series, and for only portions thereof, that the amount of the Refunding Bonds, maturities, terms, and interest rate or rates borne by the Refunding Bonds to be issued by the County will most probably be different from such assumptions and that the Refunding Financial Plan will also most probably be different from that attached hereto as Exhibit A. The Chief Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized and directed to determine the amount of the Refunding Bonds to be issued, the date or dates of such bonds and the date or dates of issue, maturities and terms thereof, the provisions relating to the redemption of Refunding Bonds prior to maturity, whether the Refunding Bonds will be insured by a policy or policies of municipal bond insurance or otherwise enhanced by a credit enhancement facility or facilities, whether the Refunding Bonds shall be sold at a discount in the manner authorized by paragraph e of Section 57.00 of the Local Finance Law, and the rate or rates of interest to be borne thereby, whether the Refunding Bonds shall be issued having substantially level or declining annual debt service and all matters related thereto, and to prepare, or cause to be provided, a final Refunding Financial Plan for the Refunding Bonds and all powers in connection therewith are hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer; provided, that the terms of the Refunding Bonds to be issued, including the rate or rates of interest borne thereby, shall comply with the requirements of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law. The Chief Fiscal Officer shall file a copy of his certificate determining the details of the Refunding Bonds and the final Refunding Financial Plan with the Clerk of the County Legislature not later than ten (10) days after the delivery of the Refunding Bonds, as herein provided.

Section 5. The Chief Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to enter into an escrow contract or contracts (collectively the “Escrow Contract”) with a bank or trust company, or with banks or trust companies, located and authorized to do business in this State as said Chief Fiscal Officer shall designate (collectively the “Escrow Holder”) for the purpose of having the Escrow Holder act, in connection with the Refunding Bonds, as the escrow holder to perform the services described in Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The faith and credit of said County of Onondaga, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Refunding Bonds as the same become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall be annually levied on all the taxable real property in said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such Refunding Bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 7. All of the proceeds from the sale of the Refunding Bonds, including the premium, if any, but excluding accrued interest thereon, shall immediately upon receipt thereof be placed in escrow with the Escrow Holder for the Refunded Bonds. Accrued interest on the Refunding Bonds shall be paid to the County to be expended to pay interest on the Refunding Bonds. Such proceeds as are deposited in the escrow deposit fund to be created and established pursuant to the Escrow Contract, whether in the form of cash or investments, or both, inclusive of any interest earned from the investment thereof, shall be irrevocably committed and pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Refunded Bonds in accordance with Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law, and the holders, from time to time, of the Refunded Bonds shall have a lien upon such moneys held by the Escrow Holder. Such pledge and lien shall become valid and binding upon the issuance of the Refunding Bonds and the moneys and investments held by the Escrow Holder for the Refunded Bonds in the escrow deposit fund shall immediately be subject thereto without any further act. Such pledge and lien shall be valid and binding as against all parties having claims of any kind in tort, contract or otherwise against the County irrespective of whether such parties have notice thereof.

Section 8. Notwithstanding any other provision of this resolution, so long as any of the Refunding Bonds shall be outstanding, the County shall not use, or permit the use of, any proceeds from the sale of the Refunding Bonds in any manner which would cause the Refunding Bonds to be an “arbitrage bond” as defined in Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and, to the extent applicable, the Regulations promulgated by the United States Treasury Department thereunder.

Section 9. In accordance with the provisions of Section 53.00 and of paragraph h of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law, in the event such bonds are refunded, the County hereby elects to call in and redeem each Refunded Bond which the Chief Fiscal Officer shall determine to be refunded at the earliest call date available. The sum to be paid therefor on such redemption date shall be the par value thereof plus the redemption premium, if any, as provided in the Refunded Bond Certificate, and the accrued interest to such redemption date. The Escrow Agent for the Refunding Bonds is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of such call for redemption to be given in the name of the County in the manner and within the times provided in the Refunded Bond Certificate. Such notice of redemption shall be in substantially the form attached to the Escrow Contract. Upon the issuance of the Refunding Bonds, the election to call in and redeem the callable Refunded Bonds and the direction to the Escrow Agent to cause notice thereof to be given as provided in this paragraph shall become irrevocable, provided that this paragraph may be amended from time to time as may be necessary in order to comply with the publication requirements of paragraph a of Section 53.00 of the Local Finance Law, or any successor law thereto.

Section 10. The Chief Fiscal Officer and all other officers, employees and agents of the County are hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf of the County to execute and deliver all certificates and other documents, perform all acts and do all things required or contemplated to be executed, performed or done by this resolution or any document or agreement approved hereby.

Section 11. All other matters pertaining to the terms and issuance of the Refunding Bonds shall be determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer and all powers in connection thereof are hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer.

Section 12. The validity of the Refunding Bonds may be contested only if:

1. Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or

2. The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
3. Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 13. A summary of this resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in the official newspaper of said County, together with a notice of the Clerk of the Legislature in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE PURSUANT TO SECTION 90.10 OF THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW OF REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, TO BE DESIGNATED SUBSTANTIALLY “PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT REFUNDING (SERIAL) BONDS” AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN RELATION THERETO AND THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS TO BE REFUNDED THEREBY.

WHEREAS, the County of Onondaga, New York (hereinafter, the “County”) heretofore issued (i) \$79,900,000 General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2015 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before May 28, 2015 (the “2015 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2015 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2015, being dated May 28, 2015 with remaining maturities on May 15 in each of the years 2026 through 2045, both inclusive (the “2015 Bonds”); (ii) \$35,885,500 General Obligation Refunding (Serial) Bonds, 2016 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before November 16, 2016 (the “2016 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2016 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation Refunding (Serial) Bonds, 2016, being dated November 16, 2016 with remaining maturities on March 1 in each of the years 2026 through 2030, both inclusive (the “2016 Bonds”); (iii) \$21,780,000 General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2017 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before July 26, 2017 (the “2017 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2017 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2017, being dated July 26, 2017 with remaining maturities on April 15 in each of the years 2026 through 2037, both inclusive (the “2017 Bonds”); (iv) \$51,960,000 General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2018 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before October 11, 2018 (the “2018 Bond Certificate”) to finance the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2018 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2018, being dated October 11, 2018 with remaining maturities on April 15 in each of the years 2026 through 2038, both inclusive (the “2018 Bonds”); and (v) \$44,777,388 General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2019 pursuant to a bond determination certificate dated on or before July 3, 2019 (the “2019 Bond Certificate”) to finance

the cost of various purposes in and for said County as further described in the 2019 Bond Certificate, such General Obligation (Serial) Bonds, 2019, being dated July 3, 2019 with remaining maturities on June 1 in each of the years 2026 through 2039, both inclusive (the “2019 Bonds” and, together with the 2015 Bonds, 2016 Bonds, 2017 Bonds and 2018 Bonds, the “Refunded Bonds”); and

WHEREAS, it would be in the public interest to refund all or a portion of the remaining outstanding callable principal balance of the Refunded Bonds by the issuance of refunding bonds pursuant to Section 90.00 or Section 90.10, as applicable of the Local Finance Law; and

WHEREAS, such refunding will only be undertaken if it results in present value savings in debt service as required by Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, by the County Legislature of the County of Onondaga, New York, as follows:

Section 1. For the object or purpose of refunding the outstanding callable principal balance of the Refunded Bonds as more fully set forth in the Refunding Financial Plan (hereinafter defined), including providing moneys which, together with the interest earned from the investment of certain of the proceeds of the refunding bonds herein authorized, shall be sufficient to pay (i) the principal amount of such Refunded Bonds, (ii) the aggregate amount of unmatured interest payable on such Refunded Bonds to and including the date on which the Refunded Bonds which are callable are to be called prior to their respective maturities in accordance with the refunding financial plan, as hereinafter defined, (iii) the costs and expenses incidental to the issuance of the refunding bonds herein authorized, including the development of the refunding financial plan, as hereinafter defined, costs and expenses of executing and performing the terms and conditions of the escrow contract or contracts, as hereinafter defined, and fees and charges of the escrow holder or holders, as hereinafter mentioned, (iv) the premium or premiums for a policy or policies of municipal bond insurance or cost or costs of other credit enhancement facility or facilities, for the refunding bonds herein authorized, or any portion thereof, there are hereby authorized to be issued not exceeding \$130,000,000 refunding serial bonds of the County pursuant to the provisions of Section 90.00 or Section 90.10, as applicable of the Local Finance Law (the “Refunding Bonds”), it being anticipated that the amount of Refunding Bonds actually to be issued will be approximately \$98,520,000, as provided in Section 4 hereof.

Section 2. The Refunding Bonds may be subject to redemption prior to maturity upon such terms as the Chief Fiscal Officer shall prescribe, which terms shall be in compliance with the requirements of Section 53.00 (b) of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that:

- (a) the maximum amount of the Refunding Bonds authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution does not exceed the limitation imposed by subdivision 1 of paragraph b of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law;
- (b) the maximum period of probable usefulness permitted by law at the time of the issuance of the Refunded Bonds for each object or purpose for which such Refunded Bonds were issued is as specified in the 2016 Bond Certificate, 2017 Bond Certificate, 2018 Bond Certificate and 2019 Bond Certificate which is incorporated herein by reference;

- (c) the last installment of the Refunding Bonds will mature not later than the expiration of the respective period of probable usefulness of the objects or purposes for which said Refunded Bonds were issued in accordance with the provisions of subdivision 1 of paragraph c of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law.
- (d) the estimated present value of the total debt service savings anticipated as a result of the issuance of the Refunding Bonds, computed in accordance with the provisions of subdivision 2 of paragraph b of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law, with regard to the Refunded Bonds is as shown in the Refunding Financial Plan described in Section 4 hereof.

Section 4. The financial plan for the refunding authorized by this resolution (the “Refunding Financial Plan”), showing the sources and amounts of all moneys required to accomplish such refunding, the estimated present value of the total debt service savings and the basis for the computation of the aforesaid estimated present value of total debt service savings, are set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part of this resolution. The Refunding Financial Plan has been prepared based upon the assumption that the Refunding Bonds will be issued in one series, and that the Refunding Bonds will mature, be of such terms, and bear interest as set forth on Exhibit A.

Section 5. The Chief Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to enter into an escrow contract or contracts (collectively the “Escrow Contract”) with a bank or trust company, or with banks or trust companies, located and authorized to do business in this State as said Chief Fiscal Officer shall designate (collectively the “Escrow Holder”) for the purpose of having the Escrow Holder act, in connection with the Refunding Bonds, as the escrow holder to perform the services described in Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The faith and credit of said County of Onondaga, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Refunding Bonds as the same become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall be annually levied on all the taxable real property in said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such Refunding Bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 7. All of the proceeds from the sale of the Refunding Bonds, including the premium, if any, but excluding accrued interest thereon, shall immediately upon receipt thereof be placed in escrow with the Escrow Holder for the Refunded Bonds.

Section 8. All other matters pertaining to the terms and issuance of the Refunding Bonds shall be determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer and all powers in connection thereof are hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer.

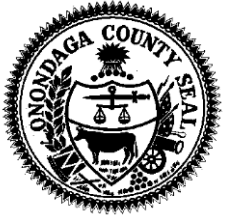

ONONDAGA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PROGRAM AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION SHEET

PURPOSE:

Create an additional Records Compliance Manager position within the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office

OBJECTIVE/ WORK PLAN:

The Onondaga County Sheriff's Office requires an additional Records Compliance Manager position to support the implementation of body worn cameras for custody and correctional deputies. This initiative will ensure the timely and accurate fulfillment of discovery obligations and FOIL requests involving digital video and audio content. Effective management of this digital evidence is essential to support the successful prosecution of pending criminal cases, maintain chain of custody integrity, comply with legal retention and disclosure requirements, and uphold department accountability and transparency standards. This additional position will facilitate proper storage, retrieval, redactions and release of footage in accordance with applicable laws and policies, thereby mitigating risks associated with delayed or incomplete responses to legal requests.

FUNDING SOURCE:

Enclosed for your review and consideration is a tentative agreement for a successor Collective Bargaining Agreement, (hereinafter “CBA”) between Onondaga County and Onondaga Corrections Captain’s Association (hereinafter “OCCA”) for a one (1) year term January 1, 2025- December 31, 2025.

The Agreement provides for wage adjustments as follows:

Year 1 (2025) – Effective and retroactive to the first full pay period after January 1, 2025 – 3%

Other financial impacts in the agreement include increases to the Equity Stipend, Solo Captain Stipend and Officer of the Day Stipend. The rest of the contract provisions will remain the same for the term of the agreement.

The net cost of the package is approximately \$9,100.

The Agreement has been ratified by the membership vote and is now scheduled to come before you for your meeting scheduled on August 6, 2024.

Attached, please find the tentative agreement for 2025 that specifies the agreed terms.

TENTATIVE SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This final tentative agreement will set the terms for a new collective bargaining agreement, subject to ratification by the Union Membership and adoption by the County Legislature. Any and all terms of the most recently expired collective bargaining agreement not specifically addressed in the final tentative agreement shall remain unchanged. All proposals made by either party that are not addressed in this final tentative agreement are withdrawn. All proposals are effective upon ratification and adoption by the County Legislature, unless otherwise noted. The Union and its bargaining committee will recommend ratification of this final tentative agreement to the membership.

1. Article 33 – Term of Agreement

- The terms of this Agreement and each of its provisions unless otherwise provided shall be effective as of the date of ratification of this Agreement by the Union membership and continue in full force from January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025. All new or modified terms without a specific effective date shall become effective on January 1, 2025 or the first full pay period after January 1, 2025, whichever is applicable.

2. Article 14 - Salaries

- A) Salary Schedule- Effective and retroactive to the first full pay period after 1/1/2025 – 3% increase

3. Article 14 C. Officer of the Day 3.)

- It is agreed that the compensation for performance of the Officer of the Day assignment is ~~two (2)~~ three (3) hours of straight time cash at the regular rate of compensation for each one (1) week of rotation. Effective and retroactive to the first full pay period of 01/01/2025.


4. Article 14 D. Equity Stipend


5. Article 14 E - Jamesville Solo Captain

RESOLUTION OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA ELECTING A
CENTS PER GALLON RATE OF SALES AND COMPENSATING USE TAXES ON MOTOR
FUEL AND DIESEL MOTOR FUEL, IN LIEU OF THE PERCENTAGE RATE OF SUCH
TAXES, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF ARTICLE 29 OF THE TAX LAW OF THE
STATE OF NEW YORK

Be it enacted, by the Legislature of the County of Onondaga, as follows:

SECTION 1. Resolution No. 372 of 1967, is amended by adding a new section 4-B to read as follows:

Section 4-B. Cents per gallon rate of sales and compensating use taxes on motor fuel and diesel motor fuel.

Notwithstanding any provision of this enactment to the contrary in lieu of the percentage rate of sales and compensating use taxes imposed on receipts from the retail sale of and consideration given or contracted to be given for, or for the use of, motor fuel and diesel motor fuel, such taxes shall be imposed at a rate of cents per gallon of such motor fuel or diesel motor fuel, in the manner prescribed by subdivision (m) of section 1111 of the New York Tax Law, provided that, for purposes of calculating the cents per gallon rate of tax, such receipts or consideration shall be limited to four (4) dollars per gallon of either such fuel. Provided that, if the average price of such fuels changes as described in such subdivision (m) of section 1111 of the Tax Law, the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance shall adjust the cents per gallon tax rate on such fuels in the manner prescribed in such subdivision (m) of section 1111 of the Tax Law.

SECTION 2. This resolution shall take effect June 1, 2026 and shall expire or be deemed repealed as of September 1, 2026.
