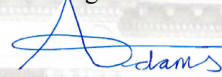

Term limits are warranted for the Onondaga County Executive position-

Looking at the history of the Onondaga County Executive. 1962 was the first year, the office was established. John Mulroy was the 1st County Executive holding the position for a quarter of a century. Twenty-five years is a long time to be in office, and just think of the changes in our Country during that same time period. Second County Executive was Nicholas Pirro, whom held the position for 20 years. What about young energy & new ideas? We are seeing many of his singular views regarding the Columbus statue.

Then came, Joanie Mahoney, third County Executive and the first woman to hold the County Executive position for 10 years. Her Father's political career paved the way for her appointment, no doubt there. Joanie Mahoney appointed Ryan McMahan in 2018 to finish out her term. A tactic which enabled him to preside in the position before actually being voted in by county constituents. Ryan McMahan was elected officially in November 2019 and November 2023, each for a 4 year term. Ryan McMahan's term is up December 31, 2027. Both the duration and the details regarding his initial appointment, do not by any means imply a quick change in the rules of county government in him holding this county executive position. In fact, residents of the county might say that their priorities that they care about the most, might not have been addressed with the recent position holder, gerrymandered maps, initially hand picked committees to determine the maps, healthcare crises during the pandemic, decision on where county monies will be spent, exhibiting divided politics, and most recently the push for an aquarium that has been shown to be a money drain on communities, according to studies in other cities. Onondaga County is more than ready for a change in leadership in the County Executive position, one that addresses all residents, not just a few. The future of the county needs addressing with a clear and present vision which will look at all the resources and view it in the lens of future generations and climate impacts. Term limits are warranted for the Onondaga County Executive position to allow for positive change and outcomes, and many residents in Onondaga County possess this similar view.

To the Honorable Members of the Onondaga County Legislature,

I am writing to express my support for a 12 year term for the Onondaga County Executive and Comptroller.

I am pleased to see there is bipartisan support for term limits for these offices overall as there was last year when a 12 year term was placed on the ballot in 2025. When the question turns to how long the limit should be, 16 years seems to negate the implementation of term limits to begin with.

Thomas Jefferson, who was a supporter of limited government, believed that limited lengths of office was one way to attain that goal. He stated in 1799, "...offices are as acceptable here as elsewhere, and when once a man has cast a longing eye on them, a rottenness begins in his conduct..." 16 years would certainly fall into the definition of a "longing eye" and is longer than even President Franklin Roosevelt served prior to the implementation of Presidential term limits in 1951.

When Jefferson was looking at the end of his own two terms as president he made clear, "General Washington set the example of voluntary retirement after eight years. I shall follow it...Perhaps it may beget a disposition to establish it by an amendment of the Constitution."

Executive and legislative offices were never intended to be professional or long term in their design, and I firmly believe that 16 years is too long. In my honest opinion, I feel that a term limit of 8 years for all elected offices is enough to leave a mark, but if I am choosing between 12 and 16, I would choose 12.

If we are all in agreement on the concept of term limits, it is important to ask ourselves, "why?"

According to the non-partisan advocacy group, US Term Limits, there are numerous reasons to support Term Limits. Among these reasons are:

Preventing entrenched power, Reducing corruption, Introducing fresh perspectives, and Increasing competitiveness. In every single one of these purposes a 12 year limit, achieves these goals

much more effectively than a 16 year limit.

I can provide one more reason why we need to be very cautious on providing too many terms to the executive, Andrew Cuomo. Governor Andrew Cuomo was elected to three terms and was planning on running for a fourth and likely would have won, had he not been forced out. In the governorship of Andrew Cuomo we saw all of the following, entrenched power, corruption, a lack of fresh perspectives, and a lack of competitiveness.

This is not to say that every executive is an Andrew Cuomo, or that County Executive McMahan is an Andrew Cuomo, but an Andrew Cuomo could absolutely be on the horizon from any political party. Limiting an executive to 8 (or 12) years could protect the public from a tyrannical rule like Andrew Cuomo's. A 16 year rule could only exacerbate it.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Pursuant to Article 3, Section 20, of the Municipal Home Rule Law, a public hearing was held on June 11, 2026, at 1:00 P.M. in the Offices of the Onondaga County Executive, Syracuse, New York, to consider the local law adopted June 2, 2026, entitled "A Local Law to Ensure the Safety of Vulnerable Road Users in Onondaga County."

After careful review of the proposed local law, it is my opinion that this Local Law is not in the best interests of the residents of Onondaga County.

While I appreciate the intent of this Local Law, and believe that safety of all people on our roads is of extreme importance, it is my opinion that existing state law sufficiently covers this subject.

New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law sets forth guidance when overtaking or passing bicyclists, pedestrians, animals, or obstructions, including a "safe distance" requirement when making such passes. Furthermore, the State's "Move Over Law" addresses this issue in connection with emergency service and construction vehicles stopped on road shoulders.

What's more, it is my understanding that the Vehicle and Traffic Law is uniformly applied across all 62 counties in New York State, and that counties cannot regulate on vehicle and traffic matters unless explicitly authorized to do so by the Vehicle and Traffic Law. As such, it is my interpretation that Onondaga County is not authorized to regulate this issue as this Local Law purports.

I have confidence in our local law enforcement to effectively protect our community through enforcing existing state law on this subject.

Again, while I believe that safety of all people on our roads is of extreme importance, I believe state law controls this subject, and therefore, the Local Law cannot be approved as drafted.

For the foregoing reasons, I hereby veto said Local Law.

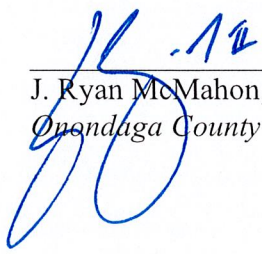

This is a good start. Any change to the County Charter needs robust dialog and consensus between the Legislative and Executive branches of government.

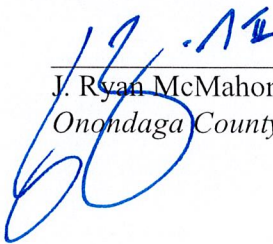
After careful review of the proposed local law, it is my opinion that this Local Law is not in the best interests of the residents of Onondaga County.

When this Local Law was presented to the Onondaga County Legislature, it became clear that this Local Law is exclusively politically motivated, and was not at all presented to provide any benefit to residents of Onondaga County. The Legislature did not present one instance as to how this Local Law would serve, improve, or provide value to our residents.

The justification used to support its presentation is that any appointee of the County Executive is somehow permanently beholden to the County Executive, and that instead, if the County Legislature gets to fill a vacancy, that there would be no way that the appointee would be beholden to the majority caucus appointing such person. That logic falls flat. Not only that, but such logic is an insult to appointees who step up to serve their community on a moment's notice.

For the foregoing reasons, I hereby veto said Local Law.

LOCAL LAW NO. ____ - 2026

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING SECTION 205 OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CHARTER
REGARDING VACANCIES IN THE ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF
ONONDAGA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Purpose and Intent

The purpose of this local law is to amend the Onondaga County Charter to change how vacancies in the County Legislature are filled. This amendment gives the County Legislature the power to appoint a replacement, who will then serve until the next possible election, when voters will choose who fills the seat for the rest of the term.

Section 2. Amendments.

- (a) Section 205 of the Onondaga County Charter, entitled VACANCIES, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 205. Vacancies.

A vacancy in the county legislature shall be filled by appointment by the County Legislature. Such appointment shall require a majority vote of the County Legislature.

The person so appointed shall possess all the qualifications required of members of the county legislature as set forth in this Charter, and shall serve until the next general election after such vacancy occurs. At such election, the vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Any vacancy in any committee of the county legislature shall be filled by appointment by the permanent chairman of said county legislature."

Section 3. Proposition. The form of the proposition to be submitted to the electors of Onondaga County at the next general election shall be as follows:

- (a) Descriptive Title.

MODIFYING THE PROCESS FOR FILLING VACANCIES IN THE ONONDAGA
COUNTY LEGISLATURE

- (b) Ballot Proposal Text Summary: "Modifying the process for filling vacancies in the Onondaga County Legislature to replace appointment by the County Executive with appointment by the County Legislature through a majority vote, with such vacancies to be filled by election at the next general election for the remainder of the term."

(c) Voting.

Voting “Yes” replaces appointment solely by the County Executive with appointment by the County Legislature through a majority vote, with the seat then being up for election in the next possible election year to fill legislative vacancies.

Voting “No” leaves the current appointment process in place.

Section 4. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Charter Amendment shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which the judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This local law shall be submitted to the electors of Onondaga County at the next general election occurring in November 2026, pursuant to the applicable provisions of Municipal Home Rule Law and the Onondaga County Charter, and shall effect immediately upon approval of the electors of Onondaga County.

WHEREAS, under Subtitle B of Title IV of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11371 et seq.), the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to make grants to urban counties participating in the Community Development Block Grant Program under the Emergency Solutions Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of such Community Development Block Grant Program, the County has executed cooperation agreements with all the Towns and Villages within the County, which agreements specify that the County, Towns, and Villages will cooperate in undertaking or assisting in undertaking the Community Development Block Grant Program and, specifically, urban renewal and publicly assisted housing; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of such Community Development Block Grant Program, the Onondaga County Executive has appointed a Community Development Steering Committee to advise on the use of anticipated funds under such Community Development Block Grant Program; and

SUBJECT: Tentative Labor Agreement – Onondaga Sheriff's Captain's Association

Enclosed for your review and consideration is the tentative labor agreement between the County of Onondaga and the Onondaga Sheriff's Captain's Association (hereinafter "OSCA") for the term of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2028.

The Agreement provides for salary modifications for 2025-2028 per Salary Schedules A-D which includes full retroactivity. This wage adjustment maintains a fair separation from the Onondaga County Deputy Sheriff's Police Association's (hereinafter "OCSPA") newly implemented agreement covering the same period. Additionally, this agreement provides increases to longevity and a clothing allowance for select positions. Other modifications to the agreement include overtime eligibility and calculations, employee leave benefits, and the discipline and grievance process. New provisions have been added to Article 24 including health care coalition and death in the line of duty language. The approximate total cost of the package is \$947,989.

The Agreement has been ratified by membership vote and is now being sent to you for consideration in advance of the full legislative session scheduled for Tuesday, June 2, 2026.

FINAL TENTATIVE AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA (“COUNTY”)
AND
ONONDAGA SHERIFF’S CAPTAINS ASSOCIATION (“UNION”)

May 13, 2026

This final tentative agreement will set the terms for a new collective bargaining agreement, subject to ratification by the Union Membership and adoption by the County Legislature. Any and all terms of the most recently expired collective bargaining agreement not specifically addressed in the final tentative agreement shall remain unchanged. All proposals made by either party that are not addressed in this final tentative agreement are withdrawn. All proposals are effective upon ratification and adoption by the County Legislature, unless otherwise noted.

The Union and its bargaining committee will recommend ratification of this final tentative agreement to the membership.

Article 15
Hours of Work

A. Regular Work Day

A regular work day shall be defined as eight (8) or ten (10) consecutive hours in any one twenty-four (24) hour period.

B. Work Schedules

1. Members shall be scheduled to work 80 hours in a 14-day period according to the pay period established by Onondaga County. Typical work schedules will follow the current 5/2 eight (8) hour work day or the 4/3 ten (10) hour work day. Alternative schedules outside of the established patterns may be mutually agreed upon by the member and the Sheriff or their designee.

2. The Employer agrees to provide reasonable notice to members in the event of schedule changes.

Article 16
Salaries

A. Salary Schedules

Effective upon adoption of this agreement by the Onondaga County Legislature and retroactive to the first full payroll period of 2025, the following 2025 Salary Schedule A shall apply to all members of the bargaining unit who are on the payroll as of the date of ratification of this agreement by the Union.

Article 19 Longevity Premium

~~Effective with the beginning of the first full pay period of 2022, the County shall pay a longevity premium of \$2,000 per year in equal pro-rated installments each payroll period to members of the bargaining unit who have completed five (5) years of service in the rank of Deputy Sheriff Captain (Police) or Deputy Sheriff Captain (Custody).~~

~~The Deputy Sheriff Lieutenant longevity payment shall be paid to members promoted to Deputy Sheriff Captain until the member achieves 5 years of service in the rank of Deputy Sheriff Captain, at which time the standard captains Longevity Premium shall take effect.~~

Effective the first full payroll period after January 1, 2025, members and all new hires shall receive the following longevity payments based on service time for the Onondaga County Sheriffs Office:

- a. After five years of service with Onondaga County Sheriffs Office: \$2,000.
- b. After thirteen years of service with Onondaga County Sheriffs Office: \$5,500.
- c. After twenty years of service with Onondaga County Sheriffs Office: \$10,500.

Article 17 Overtime Compensation

A. Where a Member is required ~~or approved~~ by the Sheriff (or their designee) or by a court or administrative agency in accordance with the current practice to work beyond ~~the regular work schedule~~ 80 hours in a pay period, the Employer agrees to ~~provide~~ provide straight time cash at the regular rate of compensation for the first five (5) hours worked, beyond their regular work schedule, in a pay period, and time-and-one half compensation ~~after the first five (5) hours worked in excess of their regular schedule in a pay period.~~ Civil Court appearances shall not be considered required by the Sheriff for overtime purposes. ~~The current practice of a fifteen (15) minute roll call time and time spent on a late call that does not extend at least one (1) hour beyond the regular training while on their regular work schedule shall receive their regular rate of compensation.~~

B. Eligibility

In order to be eligible to be paid overtime compensation, a member must actually, physically work their regular work schedule during the fourteen (14) day payroll period. For purposes of this article, paid leave accruals, excluding unverified sick leave, will be considered time worked when computing overtime.

C. Limitation

Compensatory Time

Member shall be entitled to request compensatory time off in lieu of cash payment for all hours of overtime worked subject to the staffing needs of the department or a particular unit or division thereof and shall be taken only after the approval of the Sheriff or his authorized designee. Members may accrue a rolling maximum balance of forty (40) hours of compensatory time. Members with existing balances of compensatory time in excess of forty (40) hours as of this date may retain such balances but shall not be eligible to accrue additional compensatory time until such balances conform to this provision. Compensatory time in lieu of cash payment will be awarded the same as cash payment.

Article 22
Employee Leave Benefits

Terminal leave

1. Max/Lump Sum 21 days
2. In the event of the death of a member in the line of duty or by other means, while actively employed by the OCSO and covered by the CBA, the employer shall pay in a lump-sum cash payment of all earned and unused vacation, personal leave, and compensatory time (all types) credits to the estate of the employee.

Article 24
Health and Dental Benefits

A. Health Benefits

Onondaga County Health Benefits Program

The Employer agrees to provide health benefit coverage to all members of the bargaining unit who submit the requisite enrollment card under the Onondaga County Health and Wellness Program (hereinafter "OnPoint Program").

Enrolled members shall contribute in the amount equal to fifteen (15) percent per month of the premium equivalent rates established for the prescription drug portion of the Program and ten (10) percent per month of the premium equivalent rate established for all other portions of the Program for individual coverage and fifteen (15) percent per month of the premium equivalent rate established for the prescription drug portion of the Program and ten (10) percent per month of the premium equivalent rate established for all other portions of the Program for family coverage. The Employer shall collect such contributions by payroll deductions.

Effective January 1, 2015, enrolled members shall contribute in the amount equal to fifteen (15) percent per month of the premium equivalent rates established for the Program for individual coverage and fifteen (15) percent per month of the premium equivalent rate established for the Program for family coverage. The Employer shall collect such contributions by payroll deductions.

Effective January 1, 2016, enrolled members shall contribute in the amount equal to twenty (20) percent per month of the premium equivalent rates established for the Program for individual coverage and twenty (20) percent per month of the premium equivalent rate established for the Program for family coverage. The Employer shall collect such contributions by payroll deductions.

The OnPoint Program shall establish eligibility for health benefit coverage on the first day of the ~~fourth~~ month following the date of active employment or application for enrollment. The OnPoint Program shall provide that health benefit coverage shall terminate at the end of the calendar month in which eligibility or employment terminates.

The OnPoint Plan design attached as Appendix "B" of this Agreement shall be implemented by the Employee during the term of this Agreement.

Members of the bargaining unit who retire during the term of this agreement shall be eligible for membership in the OnPoint Program provided that the member meets the qualifications established by the Employer for eligibility. Such qualified members shall contribute in the amount equal to fifteen (15) percent per month of the premium equivalent rate established for the

OnPoint Program for individual coverage and fifteen (15) percent per month of the premium equivalent rate established for family coverage.

B. Health Maintenance Organization

Members shall be offered the option to participate in a qualified health maintenance organization (HMO). The Employer shall not be liable for costs of the HMO in excess of the premium equivalent rate of the OnPoint Program and any and all excess premium shall be contributed by the individual participating member.

C. Dental Benefits

The Employer agrees to provide dental benefits coverage, as set forth below, to members of the bargaining unit who submit the requisite enrollment card under the Onondaga County Dental Program (hereinafter the "Program") currently provided through ~~Delta Dental~~ **Excelsus BCBS**.

Regular full time members may enroll for individual coverage and shall contribute 35% of the premium or premium equivalent rate established by the Program for individual coverage. Regular full time members may enroll for family coverage (including eligible dependents as defined by the Program) and shall contribute 35% of the premium or premium equivalent rate established by the Program for family coverage.

D. Limitations

1. The Employer reserves the right to self-insure, alter benefit plans or change benefit carriers provided that any new plan or change shall be substantially the same as or improve the coverage and/or benefits as provided herein.
2. No member shall be eligible for health and dental benefits provided herein both as a member and as a dependent or if enrolled as a dependent under any other health or dental benefit program provided by or offered through the Employer.

E. Death in the Line of Duty

In the event of the job-related death of a member, the surviving spouse (if any) and dependents (if any) shall continue to be eligible for employer-provided Health Benefits for the remainder of the surviving spouse's natural life (dependent coverage may terminate at age 26 in accordance with plan rules unless otherwise provided for by the plan), or until the surviving spouse becomes eligible for health benefits upon remarriage. The surviving spouse may elect to receive such benefits under either the Active (includes dental and vision coverage) or Retiree Health Benefit Plans and shall make such election in writing to the Division of Employee Benefits within sixty (60) days of the death of the member. Such election shall remain in effect until the surviving spouse reaches the age of sixty-five (65) at which time the elected Health Benefit Plan will convert to the Medicare Advantage Plan provided by the County. Normal Health Benefit Plan and Medicare Advantage Plan contributions shall apply in accordance with the CBA and applicable Health Benefit Plan rules. In the event that there are dependents on the member's plan but no spouse, the dependents will continue to receive Active plan benefits until such time as they are no longer eligible per plan rules.

For the purposes of this article, a "job-related death" shall be determined by applying the provisions of paragraph 1 of the New York State General Municipal Law Section 208-b.

F. Health Care Coalition

The County and Union acknowledge that the Union has a representative designated to sit on the Onondaga County Health Care Coalition. The County and Union agree that the representative designated by the Union to sit on the Onondaga County Health Care Coalition shall have the authority to approve plan design changes proposed by the Onondaga County Health Care Coalition without approval by the Union's membership.

Article 28
Discipline and Discharge

In all cases where a hearing officer is to be appointed by the Sheriff pursuant to Section 75 of the Civil Service Law of the State of New York, the Sheriff agrees ~~to appoint only those hearing officers to provide members with the option to elect either A.1 or A.2 as set forth below:~~

A. 1. Section 75 – the member may elect to continue to proceed under Section 75 of the Civil Service Law. In that case the Sheriff agrees to appoint only those hearing officers:

1. that are licensed to practice law in the State of New York, and
2. that are not employed by the State or Federal government or any of the civil divisions of the State, and
3. That charge a usual, reasonable, and customary fee for purposes of this Article of \$100 per hour or less.

In the event the Sheriff is unable to secure hearing officers who meet all the above criteria, the Union may suggest names of hearing officers meeting the above criteria, subject to the review and approval of the Sheriff. The Sheriff shall not be bound by any suggestion of a hearing officer made by the Union whose per hour fee exceeds \$100 per hour. The Union agrees to pay the difference between the actual per hour fee and \$100 for all hours billed to the Sheriff.

2. Binding Arbitration - the member may elect to continue to proceed under Step 4 of Article 29 of this Agreement. In that case, the member, through the Association may request in writing, with a copy to the Division of Employee Relations the appointment of an arbitrator from the American Arbitration Association, Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service, or New York State Public Employment Relations Board within ten (10) working days after receipt of the Notice and Specification of Charges. In addition, the arbitrator shall be limited to determining if the member has been disciplined for just cause and if so, the appropriate penalty to be imposed. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding upon the member and the Sheriff, subject to Article 75 of the CPLR.

B. In the event that a member refuses or fails to make an election within ten (10) working days after receipt of the Notice and Specification of Charges or who refuses or fails to request the appointment of an arbitrator as stated in A.2 above, the matter shall continue to proceed under Section 75.

C. The election of either option by a member shall relinquish and waive any and all rights to the other option and shall be irrevocable

Article 29

Grievance Procedure

The Union shall have the right to present grievances to the Employer on behalf of a member(s) of the bargaining unit, hereinafter referred to as grievant(s), free from interference, coercion, restraint, discrimination or reprisal and shall be permitted to represent the member at all stages of the procedure set forth in section (b) of this Article. An earnest effort shall be made to settle grievances promptly and in accordance with the provisions of this Article.

A. Grievance Definition

A grievance is defined as a claimed violation, misinterpretation, or an inequitable application of a specific and express term of this agreement. It is agreed by and between the parties that any member covered by this agreement working in a probationary status as defined by Civil Service Law may be terminated from such status at the sole discretion of the County and shall not have the right to challenge such action pursuant to the grievance procedure as contained herein. No member may challenge or dispute any disciplinary action or dismissal under the grievance procedure as contained herein.

No grievance or claims relating, directly or indirectly, (a) to any disciplinary action, termination, or dismissal or any member covered by this agreement, or (b) to any rules or regulations which are or may be promulgated by the County and/or Sheriff, the violation of which may subject a bargaining unit employee to discipline, termination or dismissal, shall in either case be subject to the grievance procedure or arbitration under the contract. It is further agreed that no arbitrator's decision rendered under the contract on any other issue shall be admitted into evidence, or considered, in any civil service, court or PERB proceeding relating to disciplinary action, termination or dismissal of any employee covered by this agreement.

B. Procedure

The time limits set forth in the Article are of the essence. They may, however, be extended by mutual written agreement of the parties. The failure of the grievant to proceed within the time limits set forth or to comply with the procedure established in this section shall terminate the grievance at that step. The failure of the Employer to answer within the time limit set forth will advance the grievance to the immediate next step of the grievance procedure.

All grievances shall be initiated in writing on Union letterhead or grievance form within ten (10) working days after the grievant knows or should have known of the act which constitutes the grievance. For purposes of this Article, working day(s) means all days other than Saturday, Sunday or legal holidays as celebrated by the Employer. Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays shall be excluded in computing the number of working days in which action must be taken in any step of the grievance procedure. A grievance may be discussed and resolved verbally between the member and Division Chief/Undersheriff prior to the initiation of a written grievance, however, the time limits for initiating a written grievance shall continue to toll unless otherwise agreed.

Step 1 - Department Chief/Undersheriff

A grievance initiated in accordance with the foregoing procedure shall be filed and discussed with the Grievant's Department Chief/Undersheriff. The Grievant and the Department

Chief/Undersheriff will attempt to resolve the grievance. The Department Chief/Undersheriff shall respond in writing within seven (7) working days from the date of the discussion with the grievant.

Step 2 - Sheriff/Sheriff's Designee

- A. In the event that the grievance is not resolved under Step 1, the grievant may request in writing within five (5) working days from the date of the answer in Step 1 for a review of the alleged grievance with the Sheriff or authorized designee.
- B. The Sheriff or authorized designee shall, within ten (10) working days following said request, schedule and hold a review of the matter at which time the grievant and his representative, if any, may appear and present oral and written statements with respect to the grievance. Thereafter, the Sheriff or authorized designee shall answer in writing within ten (10) working days from the date of the review.

Step 3

In the event that the grievance is not adjusted under Step 2, the grievant shall notify the Employer through the Division of Employee Relations within ten (10) working days from the date of the Step 2 answer. Thereafter, the Director of Employee Relations shall schedule a meeting with the grievant, the Grievance Chairperson and International Representative, if any, within ten (10) working days after the notification from Step 2. Within ten (10) working days after the conclusion of the Step 3 meeting, the Director of Employee Relations shall render his decision in writing to resolve the matter.

Step 4

- A. In the event that the grievance is not resolved at the conclusion of Step 3, the Union may request in writing with a copy to the Division of Employee Relations the appointment of an arbitrator from the American Arbitration Association, Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service or the New York State Public Employment Relations Board within ten (10) working days after receipt of the decision rendered at the conclusion of Step 3.
- B. It is understood by the parties that the cost of such arbitration shall be borne equally by the parties, with the exception of the agency's initial fee, if any, which shall be the obligation solely of the demanding party.
- C. The arbitrator shall not have jurisdiction or authority to add to, modify, detract from, or alter in any way the provisions of the agreement or any amendment or supplement thereto or to add new provisions of this agreement or any amendment or supplement thereto.
- D. If the grievance concerns matters not covered by this agreement or the procedures contained herein have not been adhered to, said grievance shall be returned to the parties without decision.
- E. The findings, conclusions and recommendations of the Arbitrator for resolution of the grievance shall be binding on all parties to the proceeding. Awards may not be retroactive beyond sixty (60) calendar days prior to the initiation of the alleged grievance with the County.
- F. The Arbitrator's decision shall be rendered in accordance with the time limits of the arbitration administration agency selected.

Clothing Allowance

Effective after January 1, 2026 members working in the following roles shall be entitled to a paid premium allowance of \$600 annually, inclusive of tax, as a clothing allowance; Special Enforcement, Criminal Investigation, Patrol, Fiscal. Such clothing allowance shall be paid to the list of eligible employees identified by the Sheriff via payroll after receipt of purchase receipts. Requests for reimbursement must be submitted at least three (3) days prior to the close of the last pay period of the calendar year.

RESOLUTION NO. 122

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$320,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF
ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, TO PAY COSTS OF CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE
ONONDAGA COUNTY SANITARY DISTRICT IN AND FOR SAID COUNTY

WHEREAS, by proceedings heretofore duly had and taken pursuant to the Onondaga County Administrative Code, the County of Onondaga has approved the improvements described herein for the Onondaga County Sanitary District; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide for the financing of said improvements; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the County Legislature of the County of Onondaga, New York, as follows:

Section 1. Wetzel Road WWTP, consisting of engineering expenses for primary clarifier and chemical bulk storage improvements, are hereby authorized in and for the County Sanitary District at a maximum estimated cost of \$400,000 and there are hereby authorized to be issued \$320,000 bonds of said County pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law. This is a separate phase of a project previously authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$875,000 which brings the total maximum estimated cost of the overall project to \$1,275,000.

Section 2. The maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid is \$400,000, and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of the issuance of the \$320,000 bonds of said County herein authorized, and the expenditure of \$80,000 available current funds.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is five years, pursuant to subdivision 62 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said County of Onondaga, New York, are hereby irrevocable pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. There shall annually be assessed upon the taxable real property in said Sanitary District in the manner provided by law, an amount sufficient to pay said principal and interest as the same become due and payable, but if not paid from such source, all the taxable real property within said County shall be subject to the levy of ad valorem taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Chief Fiscal Officer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the serial bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue serial bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be

determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer of such County. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Chief Fiscal Officer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. The Chief Fiscal Officer is hereby further authorized, at his sole discretion, to execute a project finance agreement, and any other agreements with the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, including amendments thereto, and including any instruments (or amendments thereto) in the effectuation thereof, in order to effect the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof, or a portion thereof, by a bond, and, or note issue of said County in the event of the sale of same to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation.

Section 8. The County Executive is authorized to enter into contracts to implement the intent of this resolution.

Section 9. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 10. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 11. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in The Post Standard, the official newspaper of such County, together with a notice of the Clerk of the County Legislature in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

AMENDING THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CHARTER TO IMPOSE A TERM LIMIT ON THE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA

Section 1. Purpose.

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Onondaga County Charter to establish a limit on the number of consecutive terms an individual may serve as County Executive and Comptroller.

Section 2. Amendment to Section 301 of the Onondaga County Charter.

Section 301 of the Onondaga County Charter, entitled “THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE; ELECTION; TERM; QUALIFICATIONS,” is hereby amended to add the following final paragraphs thereto:

Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in this Charter or Administrative Code, commencing with the first general election for County Executive held after January 1, 2027, no person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County Executive for more than three (3) consecutive four-year terms.

Years served prior to the first day of January next following the first general election for County Executive held after January 1, 2027, shall not be counted in calculating the number of consecutive terms a County Executive has served. Service for a partial term as County Executive shall not be counted in calculating the three consecutive four-year terms.

Section 3. Amendment to Section 501 of the Onondaga County Charter.

Section 501 of the Onondaga County Charter, entitled “DEPARTMENT OF AUDIT AND CONTROL; COMPTROLLER; ELECTION; AUDITOR’S ACT REPEALED,” is hereby amended to add the following final paragraphs thereto:

Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in this Charter or Administrative Code, commencing with the first general election for comptroller held after January 1, 2027, no person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as comptroller for more than three (3) consecutive four-year terms.

Years served prior to the first day of January next following the first general election for comptroller held after January 1, 2027, shall not be counted in calculating the number of consecutive terms a comptroller has served. Service for a partial term as comptroller shall not be counted in calculating the three consecutive four-year terms.

Section 4. Proposition.

The form of the proposition to be submitted to the electors of Onondaga County at the next general election shall be as follows:

(b) Ballot Proposal Text Summary: “Imposing a limit of three (3) consecutive four-year terms on the offices of County Executive and County Comptroller, effective the first general election after January 1, 2027.”

(c) Voting:

Voting “Yes” imposes term limits of three consecutive four-year terms.

Voting “No” leaves the office without term limits.

Section 5. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Local Law shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy.
