MEMORANDUM OF SUPPORT

Title: AMENDING THE 2026 COUNTY BUDGET TO PROVIDE FOR THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS TO PAY FOR ADDITIONAL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH SLUDGE/BIOSOLID DISPOSAL

Purpose: WEP is seeking to transfer funds from the Contingent Account to the All Other Expenses Account for the supplementary costs associated sludge/biosolid disposal. Sludge/biosolid disposal costs have begun to decrease with the Metro WWTP sludge dryer operating as of March 2026.

Summary: The 2026 410 – All Other Expenses budget was developed with the assumption that the Metro Sludge Dryer would become functional during 2026. The 650 – Contingent Account was established to provide funding for any shortfalls associated with sludge/biosolid disposal during the year. The dryer is removing significant amounts of water from the waste biosolids, reducing the tonnage of material requiring disposal at a landfill. However, contract increases and delays in getting the sludge dryer fully functional have resulted in sludge/biosolids removal costs exceeding the 2026 All Other Expenses budget. To cover projected costs, a transfer of \$1,281,490 is being requested for the 410 – All Other Expenses account, with \$1,281,490 coming from 650 – Contingent Account.

Fiscal Impact: This will have no impact on the budget – net \$0.

September 2026 Facilities Committee**

PURPOSE:

Onondaga County Public Libraries is seeking Legislative approval to transfer \$212,000 from the library books & materials budget line to library professional services budget line.

BACKGROUND:

Onondaga County Public Library projects a deficit of \$212,000 this year in the professional services budget line. This deficit is due to an increased need for security at the Central Library and White Branch Library. There was also an unexpected increase in snow removal expense at branch locations during the past winter season.

The materials budget will be supplemented with a combination of repurposed grant funds and streamlining of planned purchases throughout the remainder of 2026.

WHEREAS, the City of Syracuse and Onondaga County have agreed to enter into a non-exclusive lease agreement for access to and egress from the County’s aquarium development on a portion of the City Parcel (the “Premises”); and

WHEREAS, the County has agreed to construct and maintain certain improvements and amenities, as set forth in the lease agreement, to enhance the public recreational experience of the Premises, and to maintain such improvements and amenities during the term of said lease agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Syracuse adopted Ordinance No. 502-2025 authorizing the City’s entry into this lease agreement; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the lease agreement is on file with the Clerk of the Legislature; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into the lease agreement at the cost of one dollar (\$1.00) per year during the term, together with the County agreeing to install and maintain the contemplated improvements and amenities at the Premises; and, be it further

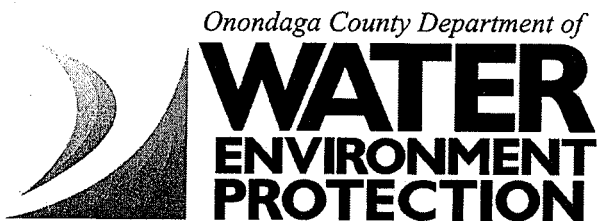

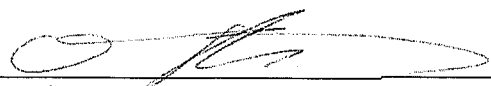

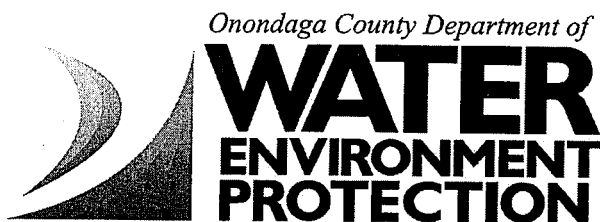

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE ONONDAGA COUNTY NEW AMERICAN
AFFAIRS COUNCIL, A TEMPORARY ADVISORY BOARD OF CITIZENS, TO STUDY
AND TO PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING SERVICES FOR “NEW
AMERICANS”

WHEREAS, Onondaga County is home to a diverse and growing population of immigrants, refugees, asylees, naturalized citizens, and other New Americans who contribute to the civic, cultural, educational, and economic life of the County, and issues affecting New Americans intersect with public safety and emergency preparedness, health and human services, immigration and legal services, language access, workforce and economic development, education and youth development, housing and transportation, culture and civic engagement, business development and entrepreneurship, non-profit and social services, and food access and nutrition; and

WHEREAS, New American residents and community leaders possess lived experience, professional expertise, and community relationships that can assist the County in identifying emerging issues and developing effective local responses; and

WHEREAS, this Onondaga County Legislature seeks to establish an advisory board of citizens, with the participation of the City of Syracuse, to review, study, identify, and recommend on issues impacting the New American community; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Onondaga County Legislature hereby establishes the Onondaga County New American Affairs Council (the “Council”) as an advisory board to the County Executive, the Onondaga County Legislature, and other appropriate governmental bodies on matters affecting New Americans; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that for purposes of this resolution, “New American” means an individual born outside of the United States, or the child of such an individual, regardless of immigration status, including but not limited to: (a) immigrants and lawful permanent residents; (b) refugees; (c) asylees and pending asylum applicants; (d) individuals holding Temporary Protected Status; (e) parolees, including individuals granted humanitarian or other parole; (f) individuals granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals status; (g) naturalized United States citizens; and (h) any other status, category, or classification under federal or state immigration law not otherwise enumerated above; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Council shall: (a) identify emerging issues, barriers, opportunities, policies, programs, and services affecting New Americans; (b) identify gaps and opportunities for coordination among County government, municipalities, and community organizations; (c) engage New American residents and stakeholders and incorporate community input into its work; (d) by majority vote, designate priority issues for focused study; (e) work with the appropriate County department or agency to examine each designated issue and, where necessary, request that such department or agency assist in undertaking a study and provide relevant non-confidential data to

inform the Council's findings and recommendations; (f) present its findings and recommendations, in writing, to the appropriate committee of the Legislature; and (g) share its findings and recommendations with the County Executive's Office for consideration of funding and inclusion in the next practicable County budget, and, where funding is needed, work with the appropriate County department and the County Executive to develop and implement a plan to address it; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that a majority of the Council's voting members shall be New Americans, and that, to the extent practicable, the New American-designated members shall collectively reflect a range of continents and world regions of origin, including Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean, and the Middle East; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that each appointing authority shall select, for each seat under subsections (a) and (b), a member possessing demonstrated knowledge, professional expertise, lived experience, or community leadership in the corresponding qualification area; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Council shall consist of twelve (12) voting members and three (3) non-voting members, appointed as follows, with the seven (7) voting members appointed under subsection (b) subject to confirmation by the Onondaga County Legislature, and one (1) member appointed under subsection (d) subject to confirmation by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse:

- (a) Five (5) voting members appointed by the County Executive. Three (3) shall be New Americans, of whom: one (1) shall have expertise in Food Access and Nutrition; one (1) shall have expertise in Health and Human Services; and one (1) shall have expertise in Workforce and Economic Development. Of the remaining members, one (1) shall be an at-large member appointed without regard to a specific qualification area, and one (1) shall have professional expertise in Business Development and Entrepreneurship; and
- (b) Seven (7) voting members appointed by the Chair of the Legislature. Four (4) shall be New Americans, of whom: one (1) shall have expertise in Immigration and Legal Services; one (1) shall have expertise in Language Access; one (1) shall have expertise in Culture and Civic Engagement; and one (1), between the ages of sixteen (16) and twenty-four (24), shall have lived experience with issues affecting New American youth in education and youth development. Of the remaining members, one (1) shall have professional expertise in Housing and Transportation, one (1) shall have professional expertise in Non-Profit and Social Services Systems, and one (1) shall have professional expertise in Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness; and
- (c) Two (2) non-voting members appointed by the Mayor of the City of Syracuse. Both shall be at-large designees appointed without regard to a specific qualification area, and one (1) of the two shall be a New American; and
- (d) One (1) non-voting member, appointed by the Councilors-At-Large of the Common Council of the City of Syracuse and confirmed by the Common Council. Such member shall be an at-large designee appointed without regard to a specific qualification area; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Council shall elect a Chair from among its New American voting members, and a Vice Chair from among its voting members; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Council shall adopt bylaws governing its meetings, procedures, voting, and committees, consistent with this resolution and applicable law, and may invite County and other governmental representatives and community stakeholders to its meetings to provide relevant information; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that members shall serve one-year terms; vacancies shall be filled by the applicable appointing authority for the unexpired term, with vacancies among the members appointed under subsection (b) subject to confirmation by the Onondaga County Legislature, and vacancies among the members appointed under subsection (d) subject to confirmation by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse, as applicable; that the Council shall convene its organizational meeting within thirty (30) days of confirming a majority of its voting members and meet at least quarterly thereafter; and that the Council shall operate for an initial two-year period, after which it shall evaluate its work and recommend continuation, modification, or transition to permanent status, any such action requiring a resolution adopted by majority vote of the Onondaga County Legislature; and that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2027, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2027 AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS WITH OTHER GOVERNMENTAL UNITS IN WHICH APPROPRIATIONS AND REVENUES ARE APPROVED BY ADOPTION OF THE 2027 BUDGET

WHEREAS, the Executive Budget for the year 2027 (on file with the Clerk of the Legislature) including the Capital Improvement Plan, the County Executive's Budget Message, and proposed local laws and resolutions to implement the Executive Budget having been duly presented to this Legislature by the County Executive; and

WHEREAS, the Ways and Means Committee of the Onondaga County Legislature has duly reviewed such Executive Budget, the Capital Improvement Plan and the Budget Message, each as submitted to the County Legislature by the County Executive; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 128-2026, a Public Hearing as required by Article VI of the Charter was duly held on October 1, 2026, upon such Executive Budget, the Capital Improvement Plan and the Budget Message as submitted by the County Executive, upon due notice according to law, and at such time all persons desiring to be heard were heard; and

WHEREAS, the total Budget of \$1,698,845,207 includes the sum of \$10,472,000 which amount is the contribution from the General Fund for the Onondaga Community College Budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2027, as adopted by Resolution No. 111-2026. From this total Budget amount can be deducted \$1,517,599,032 estimated revenues and refunds and the sum of \$34,246,175 representing appropriated prior year cash surplus, leaving a net budget subject to tax levy for County purposes of \$147,000,000. Of this amount \$10,472,000 represents the levy to support the Community College and \$136,528,000 for all other purposes; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Executive's 2027 Executive Budget (which budget is attached hereto, follows and is made a part hereof) be and the same hereby is approved and adopted as the Annual County Budget for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2027, for the County of Onondaga, and that the several amounts set forth and specified herein be and they hereby are appropriated for the purpose therein enumerated; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that there be levied, assessed and collected upon the taxable property of the County of Onondaga the further sum of \$10,472,000 for Onondaga Community College; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that there be levied, assessed and collected upon the taxable property of the County of Onondaga the further sum of \$136,528,000 for general County purposes other than the Onondaga Community College; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to apportion the various amounts according to law upon the respective abstracts for the several towns and the City of Syracuse; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the amounts appropriated for the fiscal year 2027 in each administrative unit using the expense code 641010-Regular Employee Salaries and Wages, and the number of regular positions

authorized by this Legislature for such fiscal year be and they hereby are appropriated and authorized as follows:

1. That the position in each administrative unit set forth by the title listed and the corresponding number of such position allocated to such title and listed under the column “2027 Executive Positions” be authorized as the roster of regular positions for such unit, and the Salary Plan shall be amended to reflect the titles of positions created, abolished, reclassified or reallocated on the roster of regular positions.

2. That the rate of pay for each such position shall be determined by the salary grade set forth for each such position in the column adjacent to the position title in accordance with the appropriate County Salary Plan Grades Schedule printed in this Budget, or if applicable, by such other salary rate as is authorized by this Legislature in the County Salary Plan as amended and herein set forth for such position.

3. That the rate of pay to the individual filling each such position be determined in accordance with the rules of said Salary Plan, or other applicable resolution of this Legislature, which pay rate shall include the regular compensation rate, including maintenance, if any, and where applicable premium compensation such as longevity payments, education premium in grade, shift differential or any premium payments, exclusive of overtime premium, to which such individual may be entitled by resolution of this Legislature.

4. That the amount of money appropriated for the roster of regular positions in each such administrative unit be in the amount shown for “Regular Employees Salaries and Wages” in the column entitled “2027 Executive Positions” which amount is determined as follows: The “Total Annual Salaries and Wages” set forth in the column entitled “2027 Executive Positions”, which is the sum of (1) annual salaries recommended for 2027 set forth for the incumbents listed in the roster of regular positions maintained by the Department of Personnel, (2) annual salaries recommended for 2027 for funded vacant positions in such roster computed at the starting salary amount, and (3) the amount recommended for any purpose set forth in the column entitled “2027 Executive Positions”.

RESOLVED, that no overtime premium for any employee in any administrative unit shall be paid out of the amount appropriated for the expense code 641020-Overtime Wages, in the column entitled “2027 Executive Positions” unless authorized by this Legislature or by an executed collective bargaining agreement approved by this Legislature; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the respective county administrative unit heads be and they hereby are authorized to employ as occasion may require, subject to the approval of the County Executive and/or Chief Fiscal Officer, such seasonal and temporary help at rates of pay authorized by this Legislature in the County Salary Plan as amended within the limits of the respective appropriations set forth in this Budget for such purposes in the expense code 641030 - Seasonal and Temporary Employee Wages, in the column entitled “2027 Executive Positions”; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that for all other objects and purposes, the several amounts as set forth in the column entitled “2027 Executive Positions” shall be appropriated; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute any and all contracts with other units of government for which appropriations or revenues have been approved by adoption of this 2027 County Budget and to enter into contracts with authorized agencies pursuant to law; and, be it further

RESOLVED, there be levied and assessed and collected on the taxable property of the City of Syracuse, New York, subject to any further changes in equalization rates or taxable values through December 31, 2026, the following amounts for the purpose stated herein, and that the said amounts be included in the Abstract of the City of Syracuse for the fiscal year 2027:

AUTHORIZING ONONDAGA COUNTY TO PAY THE DIFFERENCE IN PAY BETWEEN
MILITARY BASE PAY AND BASE COUNTY SALARY TO COUNTY OFFICERS AND
EMPLOYEES WHILE PERFORMING ORDERED MILITARY DUTY

WHEREAS, the New York State Military Law provides certain rights to public officers and employees absent on military duty as members of Reserve Forces or Reserve components of the Armed Forces of the United States; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Onondaga County Personnel Rules, County officers and employees on authorized military leave are entitled to all the rights and privileges set forth in said Military Law; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding those rights and benefits, calls to active duty often impose financial hardship on those summoned and their dependents; and

WHEREAS, through a series of resolutions, most recently by Resolution No. 134-2025, this Onondaga County Legislature has previously authorized the County to pay the difference between military pay and base County salary to County officers and employees performing ordered military duty through December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to extend that pay differential benefit through December 31, 2027, and pay to County officers and employees on authorized military leave the difference between such officer or employee's military pay received from the United States Government and/or the State of New York and the base County salary such employee would have received for his/her regularly scheduled work week if such employee had not been called to active duty; now, therefore be it

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 563-1978 and pursuant to the Onondaga County Administrative Code Section 11.79, this County Legislature established and imposed a schedule of sewer rents for the Onondaga County Sanitary District (“District”), and such schedule imposed sewer rents upon property owners within the District on the basis of a “unit”, using an estimate of 146,000 gallons per year for each such unit; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 118-2025, this County Legislature provided for a new schedule of sewer rents, redefining a unit using an estimate of 85,000 gallons per year for each such unit; and

WHEREAS, by adopting this resolution, such unit will be redefined using an estimate of 70,000 gallons per year for each such unit, and the schedule of proposed sewer rents provided herein will become effective on and after January 1, 2027; and

WHEREAS, the proposed schedule was filed with the Clerk of the County Legislature and with the clerks of the various towns, villages and the City of Syracuse, all within or partly within the District wherein such proposed sewer rents will be effective; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Onondaga County Administrative Code, the Commissioner of Water Environment Protection held a hearing on August 27, 2026, to consider the modification of sewer rents and has prepared and submitted a Report dated August 27, 2026, as approved by the County Executive and filed with the Clerk of the Onondaga County Legislature, recommending modification to the existing schedule of sewer rents; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by this Onondaga County Legislature on October 6, 2026; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Onondaga County Legislature hereby modifies sewer rents for the District to be allocated on the basis of “units” as defined in the following schedule, where one unit is based on the estimate of 70,000 gallons to be used per year for each such unit:

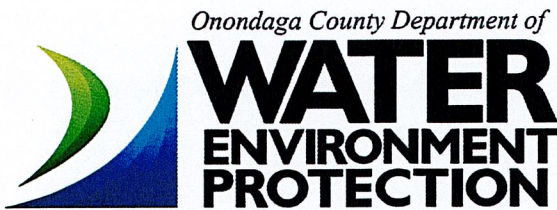
- a. Single family structure, mobile home, townhouse, condominium – one unit each.
- b. All other multi-family residential structures – three-fourths unit per family.
- c. Mixed use properties having both residential and commercial use – three-fourths unit per family plus 1 unit assigned for the total commercial space, or, alternatively, in the event that the actual water usage exceeds the calculation of gallons per unit within this subsection (c) for the residential and commercial portions of the property, the number of units to be assigned to such property shall be based on water bills, as follows:
 1. Up to 70,000 gallons per year – one unit;
 2. One unit and fraction thereof for each 70,000 gallons per year.

- d. Commercial, industrial and institutional properties – units to be assigned based on water bills, or, where property is metered, or sufficient verification exists of wastewater discharged, as follows:
 1. Up to 70,000 gallons per year – one unit;
 2. One unit and fraction thereof for each 70,000 gallons per year;

and, be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature does hereby establish and impose the above schedule of sewer rents to be effective January 1, 2027, and said sewer rents shall be levied, collected and enforced from the several lots and parcels of land within the District served by the sewer system for use of the same, in the same manner and at the same time as other County charges, and shall constitute a lien pursuant to law upon the real properties served by the sewer system; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Onondaga County Legislature hereby is directed to record a certified copy of this Resolution in the Office of the County Clerk of Onondaga County and thereafter to publish this Resolution in the official newspaper of the County at least once, where publication shall be at least thirty (30) days before the effective date hereof.

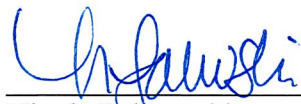

AMENDING THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CHARTER AND ADMINISTRATIVE CODE TO CHANGE ALL REFERENCES TO “CHAIRMAN” TO “CHAIR”, AND ANY REFERENCES TO THE CHAIR OF THE LEGISLATURE AS “HIS” AND/OR “HE” TO “THEIR” AND/OR “THEY”

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Purpose.

To amend the Onondaga County Charter and Administrative Code to change all references to “Chairman” to “Chair”, and any references to the Chair of the Legislature as “his” and/or “he” to “their” and/or “they”.

Section 2. Onondaga County Charter Amendments.

(a) The Onondaga County Charter, being Local Law No. 1 of 1961, as amended, hereby is amended to strike the word “Chairman” and to replace it with the word “Chair”, as follows:

1. In the second sentence of the first paragraph of Section 106;
2. In the first, second, third, and sixth paragraphs of Section 203;
3. In the title and the first sentence of the first paragraph of Section 204;
4. In the second paragraph of Section 205;
5. In the first sentence of the second paragraph of Section 207;
6. In sub-section (j) of Section 302;
7. In the second sentence of Section 702;
8. In the first sentence of Section 1903;
9. In the fourth sentence of Section 2103; and
10. In the fourth sentence of Section 2107;

(b) The Onondaga County Charter, being Local Law No. 1 of 1961, as amended, hereby is amended to strike the words “his” and “he” from the second, third, and sixth paragraphs of Section 203, and to replace such references with the words “their” and “they”, as necessitated therein.

Section 3. Onondaga County Administrative Code Amendments.

(a) The Onondaga County Administrative Code, being Local Law No. 1 of 1975, as amended, is hereby amended to strike the word “Chairman” and to replace it with the word “Chair”, as follows:

1. In the first sentence of Section 2.07; and
2. In the first sentence of sub-section (f) of Section 7.02.

Section 4. Effect on the Remaining Portions of the Sections.

Except as explicitly amended as set forth herein, the remaining portions of the Charter and Administrative Code sections that are affected by the amendments herein shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Local Law shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which the judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing, and pursuant to the provisions of Municipal Home Rule Law.

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW NO. 2-2012 REGARDING THE ONONDAGA COUNTY
SOURCE SEPARATION LAW

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF
ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Purpose

By Local Law No. 2-2012, Onondaga County provided for a Source Separation Local Law. The purpose of this Local Law is to update the Source Separation Local Law and expand the definition of recyclable materials to reflect current industry practices and standards.

Section 2. Local Law No. 2-2012 hereby is amended within Section 2.A “County Recyclable Materials”, to strike the following subsection:

viii. Beverage Cartons.

Section 3. Local Law No. 2-2012 hereby is amended within Section 2.A “County Recyclable Materials”, to strike and substitute the following subsections:

i. Corrugated Paper: Cardboard containers, boxes, and packaging, including pizza boxes, all of which are cleaned of contaminants including food wastes, film plastics, #6 PS plastic commonly called Styrofoam, adhesives, metals, and plastics. All Corrugated Paper must be flattened for transport;

ii. Glass: Empty, washed glass jars, bottles and containers of clear, green and amber (brown) that contained food and drink. This term excludes ceramic, window glass, auto glass, mirror and kitchenware;

iii. Metal: All empty, rinsed, and cleaned-out ferrous and non-ferrous food and beverage containers, including steel, aluminum, and bimetal cans and containers. Scrap metal, wire, pipes, tubing, motors, sheet metal must be recycled through scrap dealers;

vi. Plastics: #1 PET bottles and cups (including: condiment bottles, beverage bottles, and cold beverage to-go cups); #2 HDPE bottles, jugs, and jars (including: milk jugs, detergent bottles/jugs, and shampoo bottles); #5 PP tubs and cups (including: yogurt cups, butter tubs, and cold beverage to-go cups). All Plastics must be empty, rinsed, and washed of contaminants.

The following are excluded from the definition of Plastics: #3, #4, #6, #7, and any unnumbered plastics; all plastic film (including: plastic bags, dry cleaning bags, and packaging materials); vinyl; large rigid plastics (including: laundry baskets, molded plastic toys, kiddie pools, and furniture); small rigid plastics (including: toys, clothing hangers, tableware, and utensils); plastic foam materials (including: foam hot beverage cups, trays, and packaging materials); containers that held potentially hazardous materials (including: motor oil, solvents, pesticides); building materials (including: piping, and bathroom and kitchen fixtures);

viii. Paperboard: Paper packaging (including: cereal, cracker, and tissue boxes), and toilet tissue and paper towel tubes;

ix. Mixed Paper: Discarded and bulk mail, computer paper, colored paper, envelopes, empty paper cups, greeting cards, wrapping paper, and carbonless multi-part forms. Mixed Paper excludes paper coated with foil or plastic; and

x. Soft Cover Books: Paperback books, product manuals, and educational materials that neither have a hard cover, nor a metal or plastic spiral binding.

Section 4. Local Law No. 2-2012 hereby is amended to strike Section 2.L and substitute the following:

L. "Recycling Container" means the bin, cart, or other container used by Waste Generator. Recycling Containers shall be used exclusively for the storage of County Recyclable Materials.

Section 5. Local Law No. 2-2012 hereby is amended to strike Section 2.N and substitute the following:

N. "Recycling Receptacle" means a cart, dumpster, or similar container provided by a hauler, business, apartment complex, or institution for aggregating Recyclables.

Section 6. Local Law No. 2-2012 hereby is amended to strike Section 4E and substitute the following:

E. No Residential Waste Generator shall remove a Recycling Container from the County; willfully destroy a Recycling Container; dispose of an undamaged Recycling Container other than by returning such container to the issuing municipality or issuing Waste Hauler or Recyclables Collector at a designated location; or use such Recycling Container for other than the temporary storage of County Recyclable Materials.

Section 7. Local Law No. 2-2012 hereby is amended to strike Section 4F and substitute the following:

F. Every Residential Waste Generator who changes place of residence shall leave the Recycling Container for the subsequent occupant of the property or, in the alternative, shall return the Recycling Container to the issuing municipality or issuing Waste Hauler or Recyclables Collector. Every Residential Waste Generator who does not have a Recycling Container shall obtain a Recycling Container from the municipality or issuing Waste Hauler or Recyclable Collector within two weeks of taking possession of said property.

Section 8. Separability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the judgment shall not effect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which the judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 9. Effective Date

This local law shall take effect on January 1, 2027, and shall be filed pursuant to the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

LOCAL LAW NO. _____ - 2026

A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND SECTION 608 OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CHARTER AND
SECTION 6.13 OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE RELATING TO
COUNTY EXECUTIVE TRANSFERS OF UNENCUMBERED APPROPRIATIONS, UPDATING
REPORTING REQUIREMENTS, AND PROVIDING FOR EXEMPTIONS

BE IT ENACTED by the Onondaga County Legislature, Onondaga County, State of New York, as follows:

Section 1. Title.

This Local Law shall be known as the “Budget Accountability in County Transfers,” and referred to as “Budget ACT.”

Section 2. Purpose.

To amend the Onondaga County Charter to increase the amount in which the County Executive can make transfers of unencumbered appropriations within or among administrative units during a fiscal year without prior approval of the County Legislature from seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) annually to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) annually. Further, to increase the reporting threshold from one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) to three thousand dollars (\$3,000). Finally, to provide exemptions and a written reporting requirement for such exempt category transfers over ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

Section 3. Charter Amendments.

- (a) The Onondaga County Charter, being Local Law No. 1 of 1961, as amended, hereby is further amended in Section 608 to strike seven thousand five hundred dollars and substitute ten thousand dollars.
- (b) The Onondaga County Charter, being Local Law No. 1 of 1961, as amended, hereby is further amended in Section 608 to add the following third paragraph:

Section 608. APPROPRIATIONS: REDUCTION AND TRANSFER AFTER BUDGET ADOPTION.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, transfers for purposes including employee salaries and benefits, interdepartmental transfers, state mandated services, and litigation or settlement obligations shall not require the prior approval of the county legislature, regardless of the amount of such transfer. Any such transfer resulting in a cumulative increase exceeding three thousand dollars in any one line item in the budget as adopted during the fiscal year shall be recorded by the County Executive and reported to the County Legislature. Any encumbrances which when added to expenses exceed the budget appropriation shall require a written report to the county legislature explaining the reason such line item exceeded the threshold. The County Legislature may, in its discretion and on a case-by-case basis, request that the designated department representative present on any such transfer following submission of a report under this paragraph.

Section 4. Administrative Code Amendments.

- (a) The Onondaga County Administrative Code, being Local Law 1 of 1975, as amended, hereby is further amended in Section 6.13(a) to strike seven thousand five hundred dollars and substitute ten thousand dollars.
- (b) The Onondaga County Administrative Code, being Local Law 1 of 1975, as amended, hereby is further amended in Section 6.13(a) to strike one thousand five hundred dollars and substitute three thousand dollars.
- (c) The Onondaga County Administrative Code, being Local Law 1 of 1975, as amended, hereby is further amended in Section 6.13 to add a subsection (d) as follows:

Section 6.13. TRANSFERS WITHIN OR AMONG UNITS.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, transfers for purposes including employee salaries and benefits, interdepartmental transfers, state mandated services, and litigation or settlement obligations shall not require the prior approval of the county legislature, regardless of the amount of such transfer. Any such transfer resulting in a cumulative increase exceeding three thousand dollars in any one line item in the budget as adopted during the fiscal year shall be recorded by the County Executive and reported to the County Legislature. Any encumbrances which when added to expenses exceed the budget appropriation shall require a written report to the county legislature explaining the reason such line item exceeded the threshold. The County Legislature may, in its discretion and on a case-by-case basis, request that the designated department representative present on any such transfer following submission of a report under this paragraph.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State, pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

LOCAL LAW NO. ____ - 2026

A LOCAL LAW INITIATING “ONHOME,” A HOUSING DEVELOPMENT FINANCING CORPORATION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Title.

This Local Law shall be known as the “Onondaga County Housing Opportunity & Momentum Expansion Corporation,” and referred to as “ONHOME.”

Section 2. Purpose.

Onondaga County is tasked with the responsibility to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of its residents. This Onondaga County Legislature finds that increasing housing production, rehabilitating underutilized properties, promoting neighborhood revitalization, and expanding mixed-income and affordable housing provide vital regional benefits. These activities strengthen neighborhoods, stimulate private investment, support local businesses, and contribute to the long-term economic vitality of Onondaga County. This Legislature further finds that strategically deploying County capital, alongside public, private, and philanthropic resources, can overcome financing barriers and leverage additional investment.

Accordingly, this Legislature declares it a county purpose to financially support housing development, rehabilitation, preservation, and neighborhood revitalization throughout Onondaga County. This purpose shall be advanced through the creation of ONHOME (the “Corporation”), which will promote the provision of financial assistance, credit enhancements, and revolving loan programs to address development barriers, increasing housing affordability and production, redevelop distressed properties, and maximize external investment for the benefit of all Onondaga County residents.

Section 3. Objectives of the Corporation.

The Corporation will serve as the county’s primary housing development financing entity with a mission to expand and accelerate housing production across the county, as well as rehabilitating missing middle housing and increasing opportunities for workforce, affordable, and mixed-income housing.

The Corporation will leverage public and private investment, administering local housing programs, providing strategic financing, and forming partnerships with municipalities, developers, employers, non-profits, and state and federal agencies.

The Corporation will address financial and development barriers that impede housing production through flexible financing and development tools, including predevelopment financing, property acquisition funding, construction gap financing, and revolving loan programs.

Through the strategic deployment and reinvestment of capital, the Corporation will serve as a sustainable countywide mechanism for increasing housing production, revitalizing neighborhoods, and leveraging state, federal, philanthropic, and private investment to address the county’s need for housing.

Section 4. Mixed-Income Development Fund.

The Corporation will maintain a Mixed-Income Development Fund that provides financing assistance for qualifying housing developments that have demonstrated financing gaps and would otherwise be delayed or unable to proceed. This fund will increase the production of mixed-income housing, promote affordability, leverage private investment, and maximize the public benefits obtained from county-supported projects.

The Corporation may provide financial assistance through one or more of the following programs:

a. Equity Investment.

The Corporation may make investments in qualifying housing developments, including through direct investment, preferred equity, shared-appreciation arrangements, or other similar financing structures. Investments would be repaid by the developer after stabilization, refinancing, or another agreed-upon event with returns structured to reflect the duration the investment is held.

b. Performance-Based Forgivable Loans.

The Corporation may provide loans under which a percentage of the loan may be forgiven upon the developer's successful completion of a housing project and satisfaction of specified public-benefit requirements. Such requirements may include income-targeted affordability, preservation of affordability for a specified period, development in priority areas, rehabilitation of vacant or distressed properties, creation of family-sized or accessible units, supportive or special-needs housing, or public infrastructure or neighborhood improvements. The amount of forgiveness would be proportionate to the public benefits achieved and may be limited to projects that provide substantial affordability or otherwise advance identified county housing priorities.

c. Credit Enhancement.

The Corporation may provide credit enhancements intended to improve project financing terms, reduce lender risk, and leverage additional private or institutional capital, including through loan guarantees, interest rate buy-downs, and other financing mechanisms, as authorized by law.

Section 5. Neighborhood Ownership and Improvement Fund.

The Corporation will maintain a Neighborhood Ownership and Improvement Fund to support qualified organizations in acquiring and redeveloping properties in poor condition. Eligible properties may include land bank properties, vacant properties, and other property types. The fund would focus on multifamily properties, corner lots, and distressed properties, which the redevelopment thereof would have a significant impact on neighborhood condition, including providing affordable housing units and commercial opportunities.

The Corporation may provide financial assistance through the following program:

a. Revolving Construction Loan Program.

The Corporation may provide low-interest construction financing for eligible new construction, reuse, and rehabilitation projects. Eligible costs would include, amongst others, for new

construction, substantial rehabilitation, adaptive reuse, environmental remediation, site preparation, and utility installation.

In administering the program, the Corporation will consider a variety of community benefits, including, amongst others, a percentage of affordable units and community ownership.

Section 6. Board of Directors; Composition; Term; Removal.

There shall be nine (9) voting directors of the Corporation. Directors shall be appointed as follows:

- a. The County Executive shall appoint two (2) directors;
- b. The Chairperson of the County Legislature shall appoint one (1) director;
- c. The Majority Leader of the County Legislature shall appoint one (1) director;
- d. The Minority Leader of the County Legislature shall appoint one (1) director; and
- e. The County Executive shall appoint four (4) directors, subject to confirmation by the County Legislature. Of these four (4) appointees:
 1. One (1) must have a background in finance;
 2. One (1) must have a background in organized labor;
 3. One (1) must have a background in business management and/or administration; and
 4. One (1) shall be an at-large representative of the County community.

Directors shall serve terms of three (3) years. Provided, however, the initial terms shall be staggered such that Directors appointed pursuant to Section 6(e)(1), (2), and (3) shall serve initial terms of three (3) years; Directors appointed pursuant to Section 6(a) and (b) shall serve initial terms of two (2) years; and the Directors appointed pursuant to Section 6(c), (d), and (e)(4) shall serve initial terms of one (1) year.

A director may be removed prior to the expiration of a term, only for cause, by its appointing authority. In the case of removal of a director so appointed under Section 6(e), removal shall also require confirmation by the Legislature.

Section 7. Authorization to Bond.

The Corporation is hereby designated as an on behalf of issuer of the County for the purposes of issuing bonds with authority to exercise on the County's behalf all lawful powers as may be deemed necessary to accomplish its public purposes including to address the need for housing development across the County, which such powers shall include those powers described in N-PCL Section 1411 and the Corporation's Certificate of Incorporation, with the power to issue tax exempt and taxable bonds, notes, or other obligations on behalf of the County in furtherance of its purposes, provided however that any obligations issued by the Corporation shall never be a debt of the State of New York, the County or any political subdivision thereof (other than Corporation) and neither the State of New York, the County or any political subdivision thereof (other than Corporation) shall be liable thereon.

The County is hereby authorized to covenant and agree with the Corporation in a transaction contemplated by this local law for the benefit of the Corporation and the holders from time to time of any bonds, notes or other obligations or other securities (hereinafter collectively, the "Securities") issued by the Corporation that the County will not limit or alter the rights of the Corporation to fulfill the terms of its

agreements with the holders of the Securities or in any way impair the rights and remedies of such holders of the security for the Securities until the Securities, together with the interest due thereon or payable in respect thereof and all costs and expenses in connection with any action or proceeding by or on behalf of such holders, are fully met and discharged. Authorized representatives of the County are hereby granted the power to make such a covenant to and agreement with the Corporation and to take any and all actions necessary or desirable to cause such covenant and agreement to be made or enforced. The Corporation is hereby authorized to assign to or for the benefit of the holders of its Securities any covenant or agreement made by the County pursuant to the foregoing provisions.

Section 8. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State, pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
