Mission and Purpose of Community Services Board

Jennifer Parmalee announced that a detailed orientation for new members will be scheduled later, including a review of the Community Services Board's mission and purpose.

Recognition

A Certificate of Appreciation was presented to Dr. Jim Yonai for his contributions as Chair of the Community Services Board.

Review of Community Service Plan

Currently in Year 2 of the 5-Year Plan.

- Goals include blended support and technical assistance for Multi-Tiered Systems of Support and alcohol/drug prevention programming in Onondaga County school districts.

Highlights

- Expansion of Promise Zone school-based emotional/behavioral support in all county schools.
- Access “No Wrong Door” program for children and youths now has 30 employees providing preventative work.
- Adult Outreach and Navigation Team expansion underway (4 of 6 positions filled).
- Department of Health increased harm reduction services.
- Opening new mental health outpatient sites in schools and shelters.
- Partnership between Upstate and Syracuse City School District to open school-based clinics in two district buildings for intensive services.
- McCarthy and Grant sites scheduled to open in May.
- Two grants awarded to provide outpatient services, including support for homeless shelters through opioid settlement dollars.
- Opportunities for evidence-based training funded annually.

SOC Grant (Integration of MH/DD Supports

- SOC Grant will provide structured support for youth (up to age 21) with mental health diagnoses and developmental disabilities, along with their parents.
